Note from the Center Director: Cliff Cochran, Kenai Peninsula Center

The Kenai Peninsula Center for the Alaska SBDC completed the third quarter of FY 2024. For the second straight quarter, business advisors on the Kenai Peninsula guided business owners and entrepreneurs to close on loans for over \$8 million in capital projects, setting a record for the center for the third quarter. This was also more than the other Alaska SBDC advisors in the third quarter combined, indicating the quality of assistance provided by staff on the Kenai.

With business advisors providing service in each of the main cities on the Kenai Peninsula, the SBDC is meeting the needs of business owners and entrepreneurs across the region. Our model features one full-time center director based between Kenai and Soldotna, with part-time SBDC advisors in Homer and Seward, designed to best meet demands for our services on the peninsula. This has worked quite well, with Kenai Peninsula advisors logging an impressive 100% client satisfaction rating on surveys the past year, a testament to our knowledgeable and dedicated staff. This quarter was a little different, with the center director out for a large part of the quarter due to the birth of a child. Advisors in Seward and Homer did an outstanding job picking up the slack, ensuring the SBDC did not miss a beat.

During the quarter, the Alaska SBDC on the Kenai Peninsula provided significantly more advising to pre-ventures and startups than the previous quarter. Regarding industries supported, accommodation and food services retook the top spot after a one-quarter hiatus. There was significant industry diversity in entrepreneurs coming to the Alaska SBDC for assistance, with new clients on the Kenai Peninsula spread across 15 of the 20 industry sectors. The Alaska SBDC saw maybe its greatest spread of new clients across the Kenai, with entrepreneurs from 13 of the 21 communities on the peninsula starting with the SBDC. Aside from startup assistance, the Alaska SBDC provided a significant amount of advising on financing, business buy/sells, and legal issues. While our staff are not qualified to provide legal advice, we frequently identify when legal aid is needed to ensure business owners and entrepreneurs do things correctly and are set up for success.

The Alaska SBDC has had a number of transitions within the organization but has achieved stability in the Kenai Peninsula Center, with all three staff fully trained and performing at high levels for over two years. With advisors located in Kenai/Soldotna, Homer, and Seward, we're doing our part to provide the best local business support to entrepreneurs on the Kenai. We greatly appreciate the support provided by the Kenai Peninsula Borough, and we will continually strive to be an outstanding resource for business owners across the peninsula.

Summary:

During the third quarter of FY 2024, the Alaska SBDC on the Kenai Peninsula provided significantly more advising to pre-ventures and startups than in the previous quarter, when there was a near-equal spread between startups and existing businesses. This is due to business owners returning to us to review their model after summer in Q2. At the same time, Q3 sees a number of entrepreneurs looking to start new businesses in anticipation of the summer tourist season. Regarding industries supported, accommodation and food services retook the top spot after a one-quarter hiatus. Aside from startup assistance, the Alaska SBDC provided a significant amount of advising on financing and business buy/sells. There is a lot of opportunity on the Kenai Peninsula, and we're here to help entrepreneurs capitalize on it. The Alaska SBDC also provided support for several legal issues. While our staff are not qualified to provide legal advice, we frequently identify when legal aid is needed to ensure business owners and entrepreneurs do things right and are set up for success.

Summary:

The Alaska SBDC Kenai Peninsula Center on-boarded 55 new clients during the third quarter of FY 2024. This quarter again saw an overwhelming proportion of entrepreneurs sign up with the Alaska SBDC looking to start new businesses. There was also significant industry diversity in entrepreneurs coming to the Alaska SBDC for assistance, with new clients spread across 15 of the 20 industry sectors. Accommodation and food services were again atop the list of industries, followed by construction and

services. The Alaska SBDC saw maybe its greatest spread of new clients across the Kenai, with entrepreneurs from 13 of the 21 communities on the peninsula starting with the SBDC. Homer saw the greatest number of new clients this quarter by a fairly wide margin.

Summary:

An enterprise is considered "in-business" when all required licensing/permitting is acquired, has payroll, acquired debt or equity capital, incurred business expenses, and/or created sales. Jobs supported are calculated using a formula that includes the total number of full and part-time employees of a unique client receiving Alaska SBDC services. In addition, the Alaska SBDC must receive written confirmation from the client that these milestones occurred.

During the third quarter of FY 2024, clients reported establishing 4 new businesses on the Kenai Peninsula. The new businesses were started in Seward (3), Homer (1), and Sterling (1). Alaska SBDC work during the quarter directly supported 452 jobs scattered across the Kenai Peninsula Borough from Fox River to Lowell Point.

Workshops

So far this fiscal year, 84 Kenai Peninsula residents have attended <u>Alaska SBDC workshops</u>. These classes are offered online via live webinars and on-demand videos and live in the classroom. Topics cover a wide array of subjects and harness both in-house expertise and professional adjuncts.

During the third quarter, the Kenai Peninsula Center, in collaboration with Alaska Vocational Technical Center (AVTEC), offered a live Starting a Business workshop in Seward, which resulted in 24 attendees. The Alaska SBDC also offered 41 recorded options available on-demand. Those topics include Developing Your Website Marketing Strategy, Disability Law, Bookkeeping Basics, LLCs in Alaska, QuickBooks Fundamentals, and many more.
