WHEREAS, through the Girl Scout leadership experience, girls develop skills that will serve them for a lifetime so that they may contribute to their communities; and

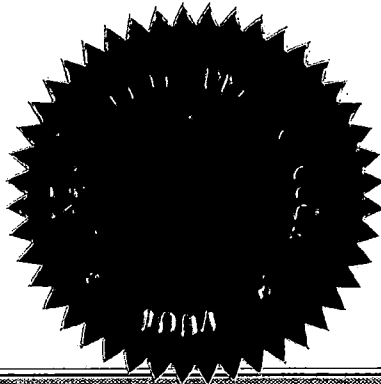
