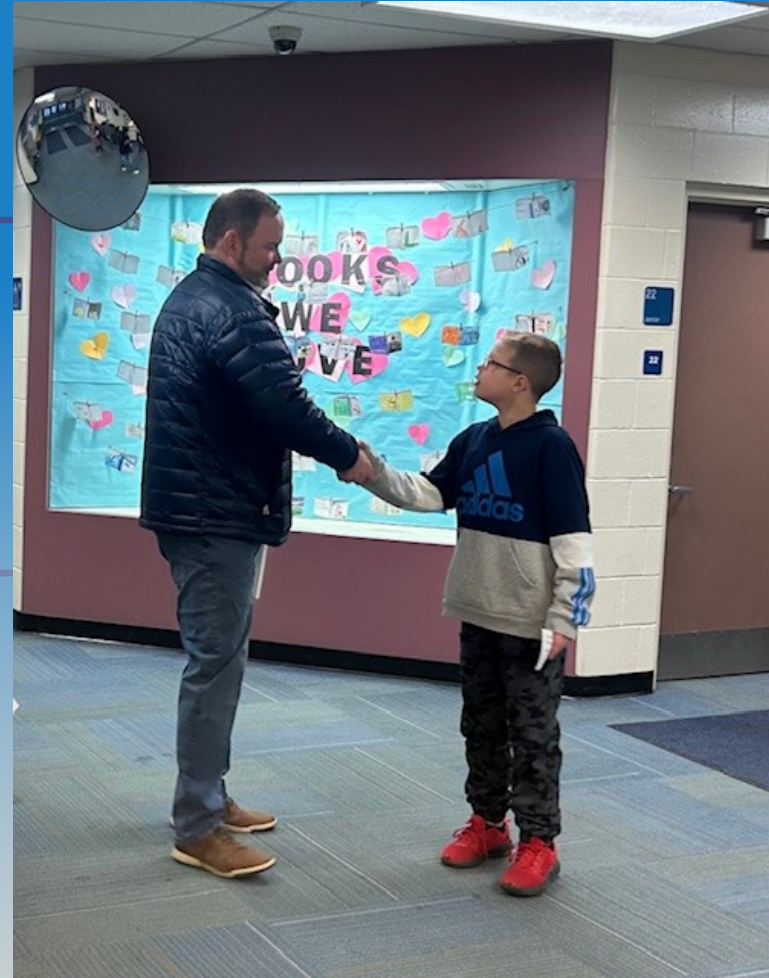

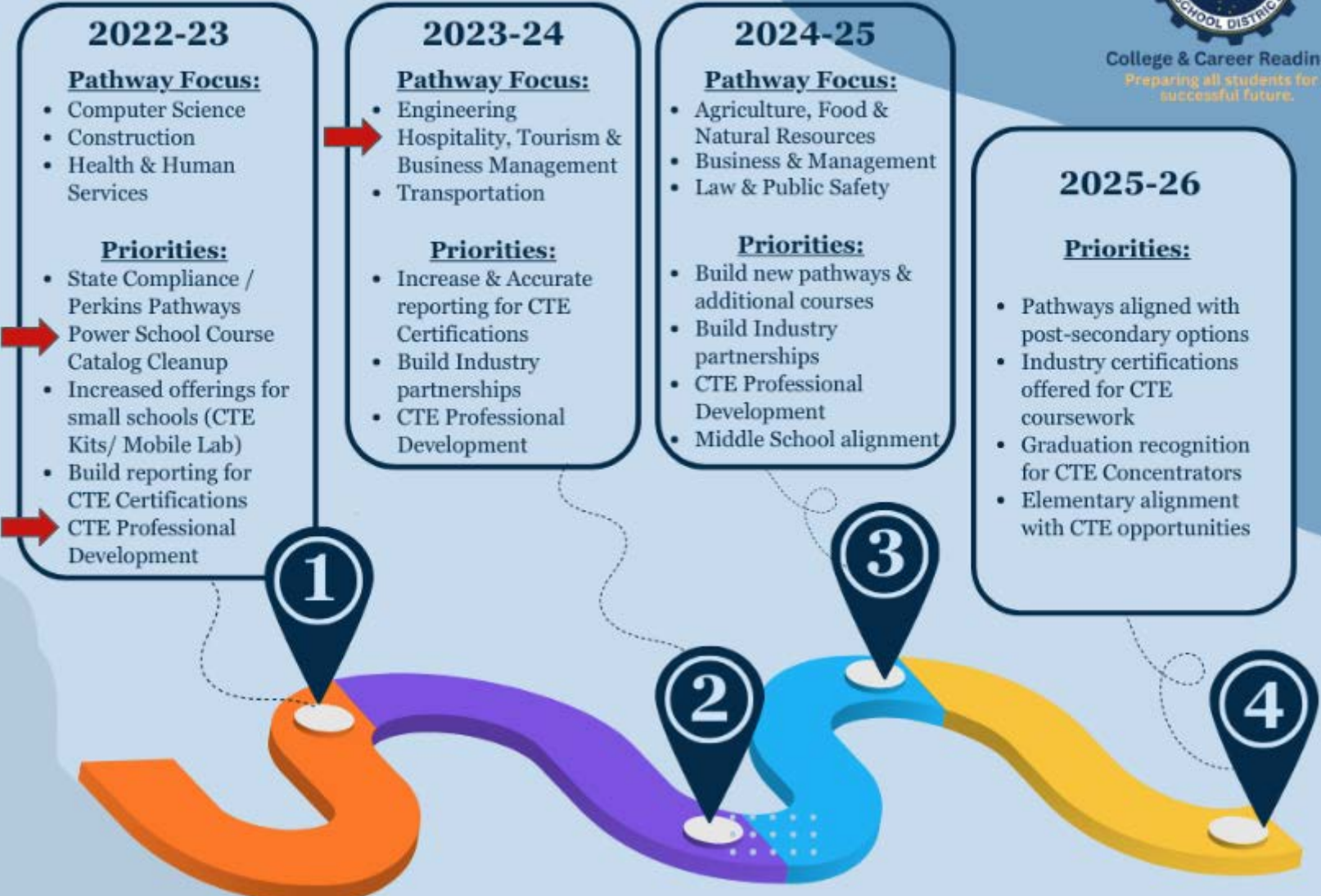

KPBSD CTE *Timeline*



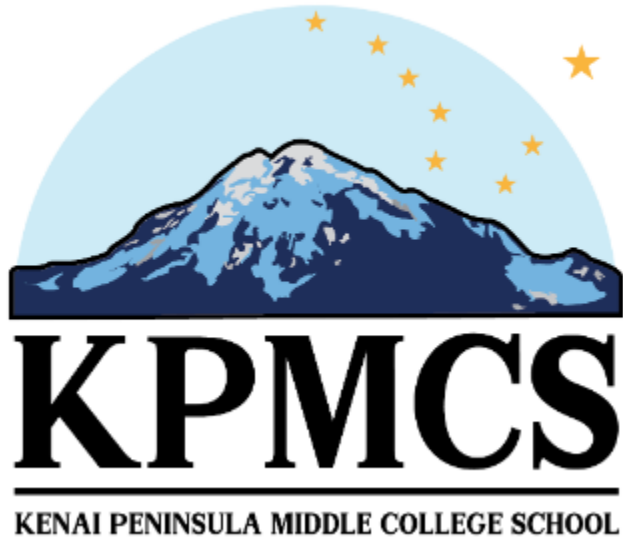

Data Review: Student Performance

Highlights: FY 21-22 School Year Data

- **Graduation Rate of CTE Concentrators - 96.5%**
- **Added 15 classes to our Perkins Reporting Data!**
- **Post Grad Placement - 67% of CTE Concentrators**
- **2022-23 Focus Area classes participation grew:**
 - CAD/CAM - 77 students in FY22 and 100 in FY23
 - Work Based CoOp - 34 students in FY22 and 58 in FY23
 - Construction 1 - 174 students in FY22 and 234 in FY23
- **NonTraditional Program Concentration**
 - 123 concentrators were non traditional gender group participants (Mostly in Construction & Human Services!) Still need to push other pathways.
- **1286 CTE Credits earned in 2022-23 / 113 students earned Postsecondary Credit / 88 Students completed work based learning**

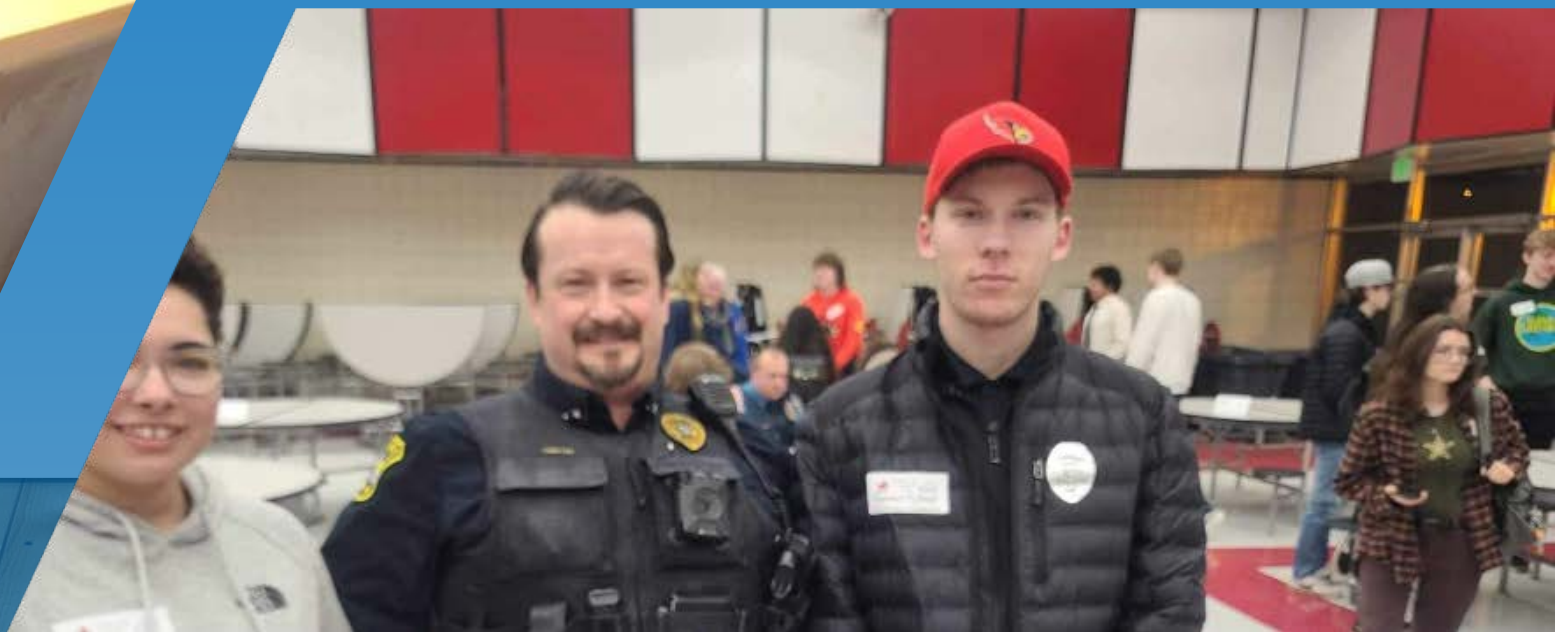

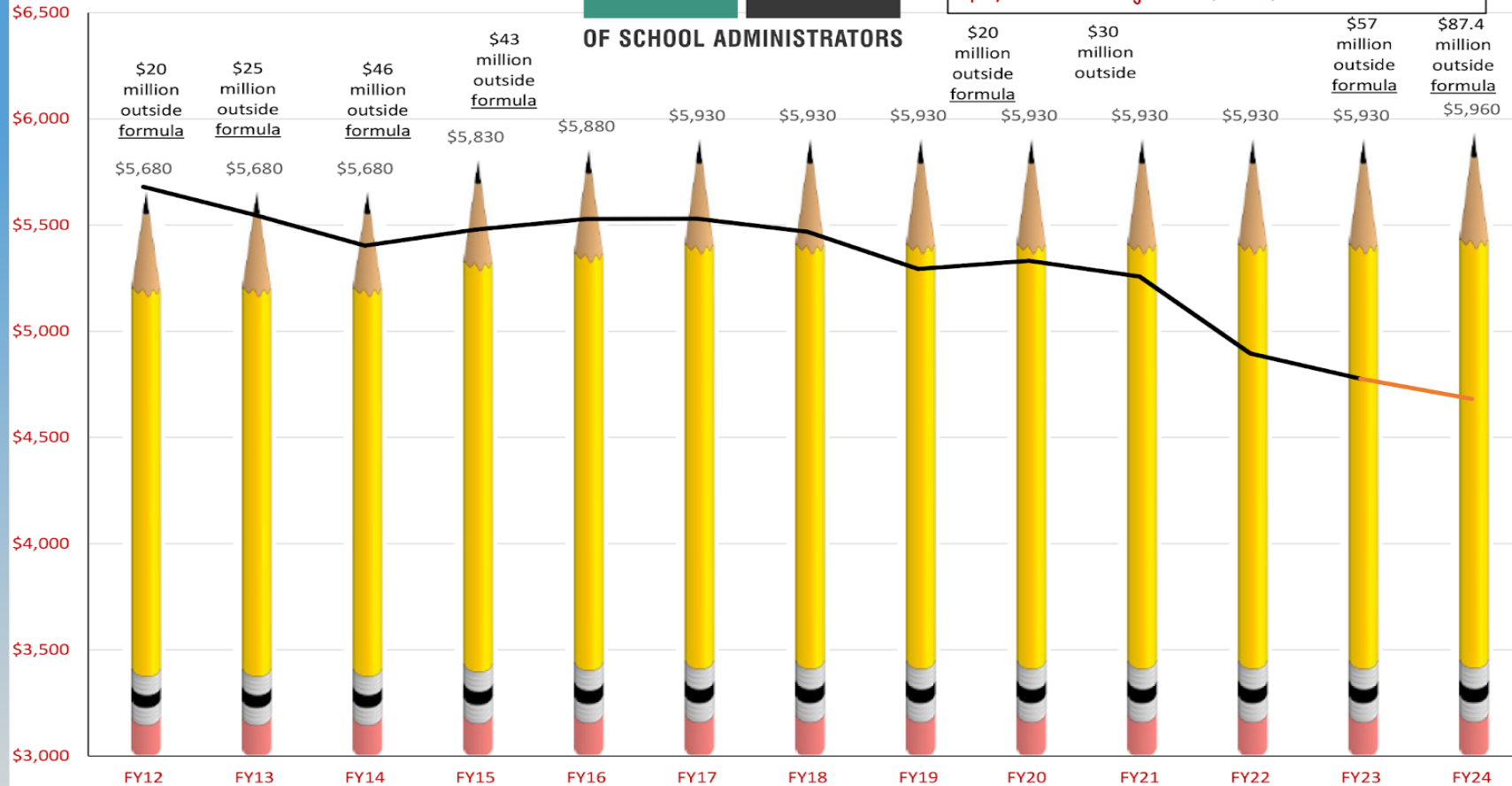

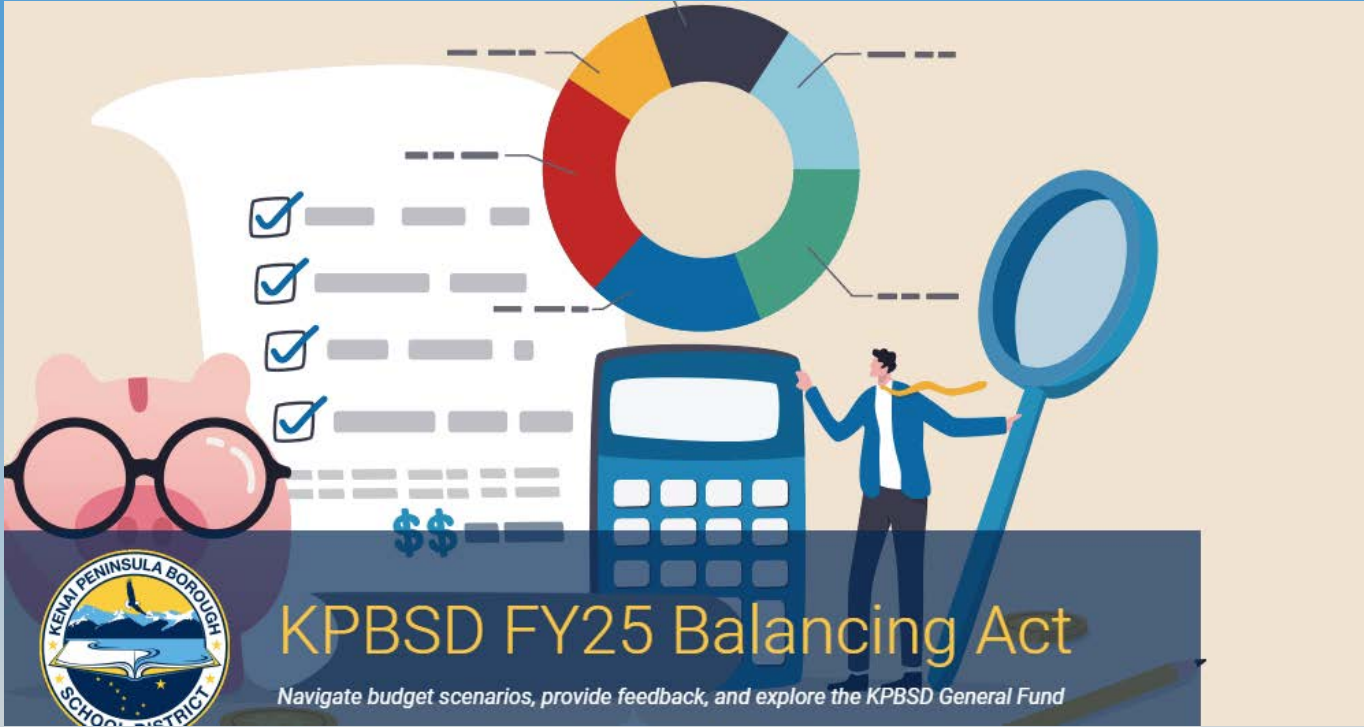


**Alaska K-12 Funding
