




Data Review: Student Performance

Highlights: FY 21-22 School Year Data

- Graduation Rate of CTE Concentrators 96.5%
- Added 15 classes to our Perkins Reporting Data!
- Post Grad Placement 67% of CTE Concentrators
- 2022-23 Focus Area classes participation grew:
 - CAD/CAM 77 students in FY22 and 100 in FY23
 - Work Based CoOp 34 students in FY22 and 58 in FY23
 - Construction 1 174 students in FY22 and 234 in FY23
- NonTraditional Program Concentration
 - 123 concentrators were non traditional gender group participants (Mostly in Construction & Human Services!) Still need to push other pathways.
- 1286 CTE Credits earned in 2022-23 / 113 students earned Postsecondary Credit / 88 Students completed work based learning



Alaska K-12 Funding Base Student Allocation Fiscal Year 2012 - 2024




Line shows inflation adjustment to FY12 value;
