Central Area Rural Transit System, Inc. (CARTS) is requesting a resolution supporting the Central/Southern Public Transit Human Services Community Coordination Plan and Project Priorities as required by the Alaska Department of Transportation & Public Facilities Transit Office in order to be eligible to apply for both federal and state transit funding. Per the Federal Transit Administration (FTA) program Map-21 (Moving Ahead for Progress in the 21st Century Act), projects funded by Section 5310: Enhanced Mobility for Seniors and Individuals with Disabilities, and the Alaska Mental Health Trust, must be derived from a locally developed coordinated public transit human services transportation plan that is supported by a local governing body. The coordinated plan is intended to provide a range of strategies to promote and advance local efforts to improve transportation options. Projects derived from the coordinated plan must also be prioritized annually and have a local governing body resolution supporting the work and intent of that prioritization.

The Central/Southern Public Transit Human Services Community Coordination Plan is comprised of representatives from Central Area Rural Transit (lead agency i.e. DOT&PF's contact), Alaska Cab, Independent Living Center, Serenity House, Change 4 the Kenai, Peninsula Community Health Services, Ionia, City of Soldotna, City of Kenai, Kenaitze Indian Tribe, State of Alaska Public Assistance, and Frontier Community Services This working group participated in a two day workshop in August 2015 to update the coordinated plan. In addition, a representative from the Alaska Department of Transportation & Public Facilities was also in attendance to provide guidance on coordinated plan requirements. Additional meetings have been held 9/18 and 10/6/15.

At this time Jennifer Beckmann with CARTS is the lead agency. The lead agency's function is to assure plan updates and project prioritizations are completed and submitted to AKDOT&PF and serves as the point of contact for AKDOT&PF.

By supporting the update to the Central/Southern Public Transit Human Services Community Coordination Plan and approving the prioritized project list the Borough is accomplishing the prerequisite to apply for FTA Section 5310 and Alaska Mental Health Trust funding through the Alaska Department of Transportation & Public Facilities for SFY17.

The Borough is not making a financial commitment with the support of the coordinated plan and approval of the project priorities for submission to AKDOT&PF.
