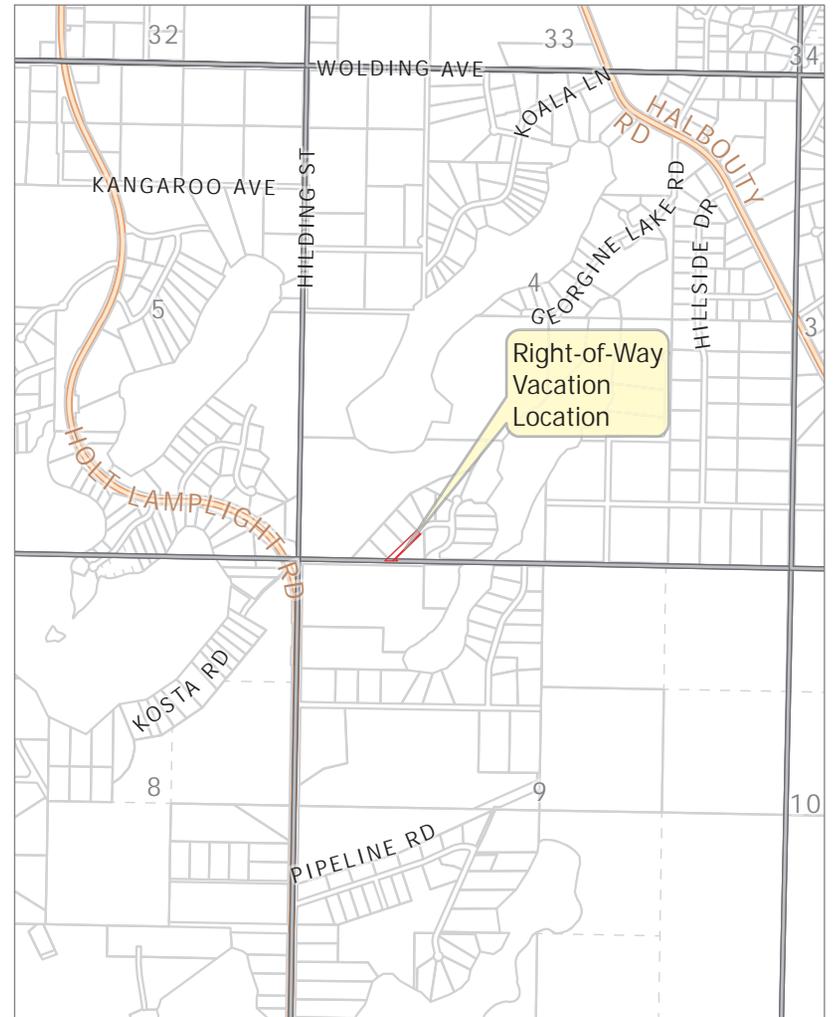

STAFF REPORT

Specific Request / Purpose as stated in the petition:

This plat proposes to relocate the intersection of Narrow Road and De Busk Drive to the west where the construction of the intersection is more feasible, safe and economical. The current location of said intersection creates an awkward and acute angle to the east.

Notification: The public hearing notice was published in the February 6, 2026 issue of the Peninsula Clarion and the February 5, 2026 issue of the Homer News as part of the Commission’s tentative agenda.

The public notice was posted on the Planning Commission bulletin board at the Kenai Peninsula Borough George A. Navarre Administration building. Additional notices were mailed to the following with the request to be posted for public viewing.

Post Office of Nikiski

Nine certified mailings were sent to owners of property within 300 feet of the proposed vacation. Two receipts had been returned when the staff report was prepared.

Legal Access (existing and proposed):

Legal access to the affected lots is by Narrow Road.

The proposed vacation is located at the southern end of Narrow Road, a 60-foot-wide dedicated right-of-way. Narrow Road currently serves approximately eight parcels. It connects to De Busk Drive to the south and Shalom Lane to the northeast. De Busk Drive is a borough-maintained right-of-way that provides access to Holt Lamplight Road, a state-maintained road.

The proposed plat, Immanuel Subdivision No. 3, will finalize the vacation, realigning the right-of-way to the east. The sketch depicts both the portion of right-of-way proposed for vacation and the location of the realigned roadway. A 60-foot-wide right-of-way, named Redeemed Road, is also proposed for dedication to the west. **Staff recommends** revising the sketch to remove the shaded right-of-way area north of the proposed vacation that lies within the remaining portion of Narrow Road, and to include the total area of the proposed vacation.

The affected parcels and all surrounding parcels will continue to have access via Narrow Road.

The block is defined by De Busk Drive, Narrow Road, Shalom Lane, and a lake. Vacating this segment of Narrow Road will alter the block length.

De Busk Drive and its intersection with Narrow Road lie within a 66-foot section line easement, with 33-feet located on either side of the section line.

Site Investigation:

Publicly available imagery indicates that Narrow Road is currently unconstructed.

Available topographic data shows slight downward sloping to the south within the area proposed for vacation.

No wetlands are present on the subject parcels or within the area proposed for vacation. Several lakes are located in the vicinity of the subdivision.

The subject area is not located within a flood hazard area or a habitat protection district.

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Staff Analysis:

In 2022, Immanuel Subdivision (KN 2022-46) first subdivided Government Lot 14, Section 4, Township 7 North, Range 11 West, Seward Meridian, creating Tract A and 6 lots.

In 2025, Immanuel Subdivision No. 2 (KN 2025-14) platted Government Lot 13 and further subdivided Tract A and lots 5 and 6. This subdivision dedicated Narrow Road.

The Assembly will consider the proposed vacation at its February 17, 2026 meeting. If approved, Immanuel Subdivision No. 3 will finalize the right-of-way vacation. The Plat Committee is scheduled to review the plat on February 9, 2026.

20.65.050 – Action on vacation application

- D. The planning commission shall consider the merits of each vacation request and in all cases the planning commission shall deem the area being vacated to be of value to the public. It shall be incumbent upon the applicant to show that the area proposed for vacation is no longer practical for the uses or purposes authorized, or that other provisions have been made which are more beneficial to the public. In evaluating the merits of the proposed vacation, the planning commission shall consider whether:
1. The right-of-way or public easement to be vacated is being used;
Surveyor comments: All surrounding parcels remain with legal access via Narrow Road.
Staff comments: Narrow road currently serves approximately eight parcels and is currently unconstructed.
 2. A road is impossible or impractical to construct, and alternative access has been provided;
Surveyor comments: Primary access to this land is via De Busk Drive and Narrow Road. This plat just simply relocates/reshapes the right of way intersection.
Staff comments: The proposed plat, Immanuel Subdivision No. 3, will finalize the vacation, realigning the right-of-way to the east.
 3. The surrounding area is fully developed and all planned or needed rights-of-way and utilities are constructed;
Surveyor comments:
Staff comments: The proposed plat, Immanuel Subdivision No. 3, will finalize the vacation, realigning the right-of-way to the east and further subdivide the area to create additional lots. Additionally, a 60-foot right-of-way named Redeemed Road is proposed to be dedicated.
 4. The vacation of a public right-of-way provides access to a lake, river, or other area with public interest or value, and if so, whether equal or superior access is provided;
Surveyor comments: The proposed plat relocates the right of way to the west (east) and so that Narrow Road intersects De Busk Drive at a 90 degree angle.
Staff comments: No access to a lake, river or public area is being vacated.
 5. The proposed vacation would limit opportunities for interconnectivity with adjacent parcels, whether developed or undeveloped;
Surveyor comments: The current intersection is dedicated at an angle not feasible to construction and creates nontypical intersection geometry. This plat proposes to relocate the intersection of Narrow Road and De Busk Drive to the west (east) where the construction is more feasible, safe and economical.
Staff comments: The proposed plat, Immanuel Subdivision No. 3, will finalize the vacation, realigning the right-of-way to the east and further subdivide the area to create additional lots. Additionally, a 60-foot right-of-way named Redeemed Road is proposed to be dedicated.
 6. Other public access, other than general road use, exist or are feasible for the right-of-way;
Staff comments:
 7. All existing and future utility requirements are met. Rights-of-way which are utilized by a utility, or which logically would be required by a utility, shall not be vacated, unless it can be demonstrated that equal or superior access is or will be available. Where an easement would satisfactorily serve the utility interests, and no other public need for the right-of-way exists, the commission may approve the vacation and require that a utility easement be granted in place of the right-of-way.

Staff comments: Utility agencies provided no objections or no response was received.

8. Any other factors that are relevant to the vacation application or the area proposed to be vacated.

Staff comments:

A KPB Planning Commission decision denying a vacation application is final. A KPB Planning Commission decision to approve the vacation application is subject to consent or veto by the KPB Assembly, or City Council if located within City boundaries. The KPB Assembly, or City Council must hear the vacation within thirty days of the Planning Commission decision.

Based on consideration of the merits as per KPB 20.65.050(D) as outlined by Staff comments, Staff recommends APPROVAL as petitioned, subject to:

1. Consent by KPB Assembly.
 2. Compliance with the requirements for preliminary plats per Chapter 20 of the KPB Code including a submittal to and approval by the Plat Committee.
 3. Grant utility easements requested by any utility providers.
 4. Submittal of a final plat within a timeframe such that the plat can be recorded within one year of vacation consent (KPB 20.65.050(I)).

KPB 20.65.050 – Action on vacation application

- H. A planning commission decision to approve a vacation is not effective without the consent of the city council, if the vacated area to be vacated is within a city, or by the assembly in all other cases. The council or assembly shall have 30 days from the date of the planning commission approval to either consent to or veto the vacation. Notice of veto of the vacation shall be immediately given to the planning commission. Failure to act on the vacation within 30 days shall be considered to be consent to the vacation. This provision does not apply to alterations of utility easements under KPB 20.65.070 which do not require the consent of the assembly or city council unless city code specifically provides otherwise.**
- I. Upon approval of the vacation request by the planning commission and no veto by the city council or assembly, where applicable, the applicant shall have a surveyor prepare and submit a plat including the entire area approved for vacation in conformance with KPB 20.10.080. Only the area approved for vacation by the assembly or council may be included on the plat. The final plat must be recorded within one year of the vacation consent.**
- J. A planning commission decision denying a vacation application is final. No reapplication or petition concerning the same vacation may be filed within one calendar year of the date of the final denial action except in the case where new evidence or circumstances exist that were not available or present when the original petition was filed.**
- K. An appeal of the planning commission, city council or assembly vacation action under this chapter must be filed in the superior court in accordance with the Alaska Rules of Appellate Procedure.**

The 2019 Kenai Peninsula Borough Comprehensive Plan adopted November, 2019 by Ordinance No. 2019-25. The relevant objectives are listed.

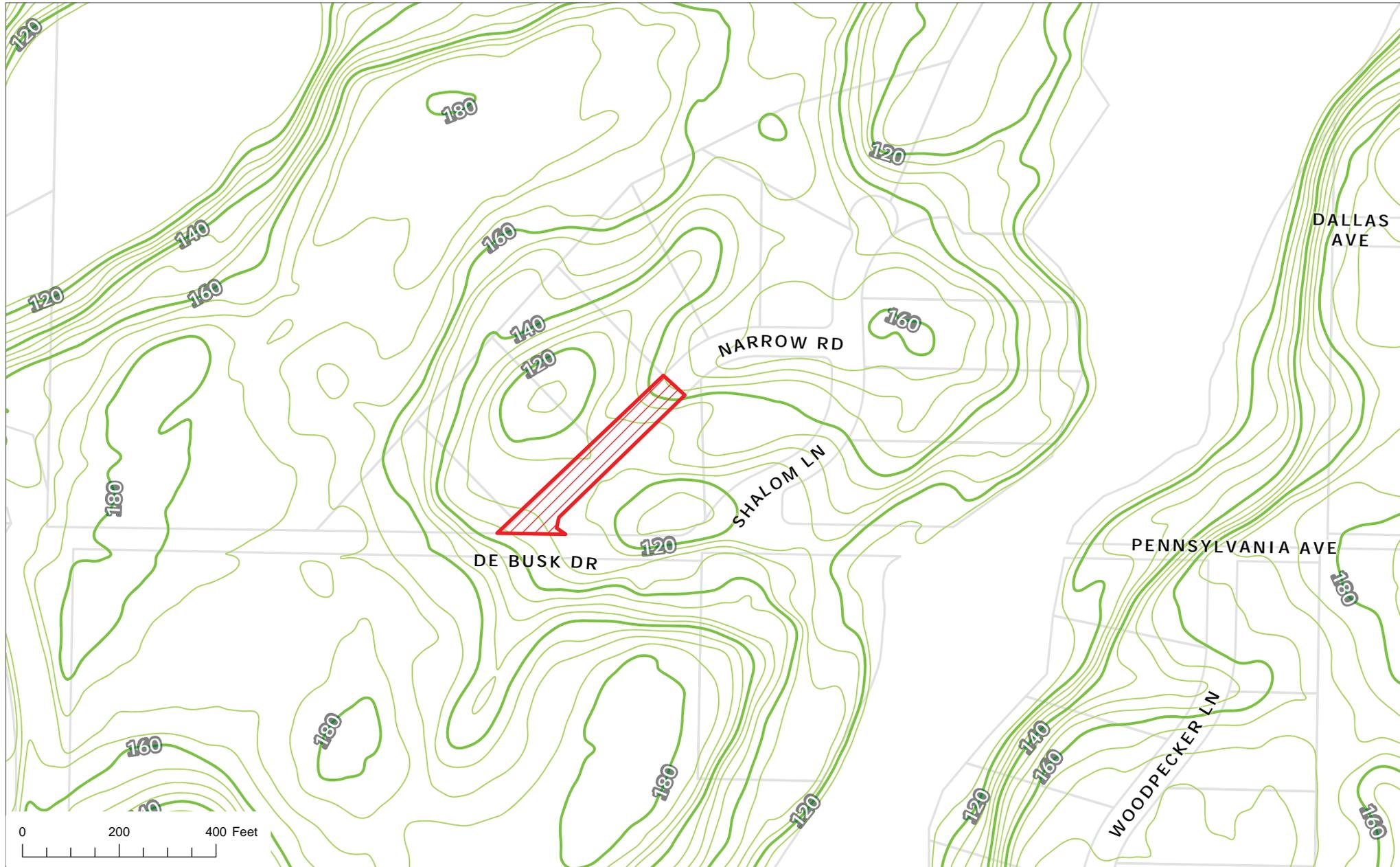

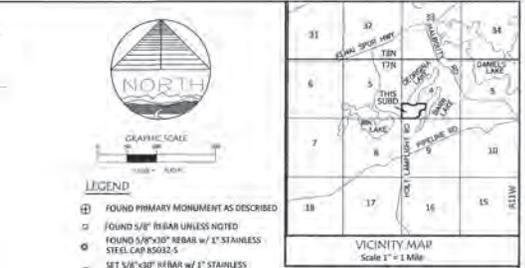
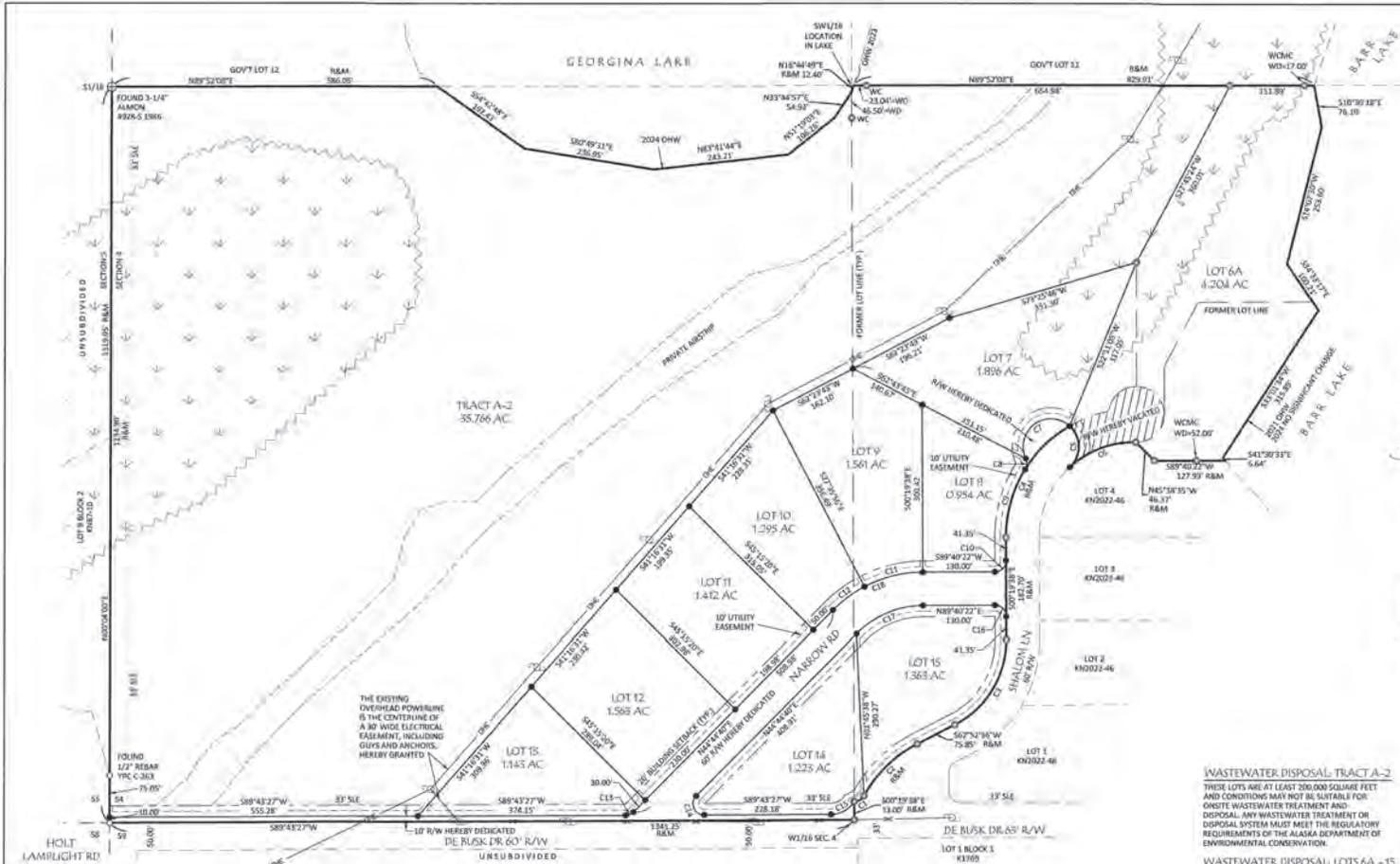

Public comment to KPB-7449 Immanuel Subdivision

Hearing 2-9-2026

The plat submission for this property should be denied or, in the alternative, be approved on a conditional basis.

The problems with the plat pertain to the placement of roads intersecting DeBusk, Narrow, Redeemed and Shalom.

DeBusk Drive encroaches upon private property directly across from the subject property in 2 places. One is where the proposed Redeemed Road will intersect with DeBusk. The other is where the proposed Shalom Road will intersect with DeBusk.

Narrow Road is not accurately depicted on the plat. The original location is there, but in fall 2025, the intersection was relocated.

A meeting was held on DeBusk Drive October 10, 2025 at approximately 11:30am to discuss re-alignment, at which time the private property was marked by Chmielowiec's surveyor with stakes and paint. It was attended by Dennis Merkes, road contractor for the Halls, a representative of McLane (name unknown), the firm submitting the plat for the Halls, Brian Conrad and Jed Painter, with KPB road maintenance, a representative of Alaska Land Surveys, the firm surveying and marking the property lines for Chmielowiec, and Susie Chmielolwiec. The boundaries were very clearly marked to show where DeBusk encroached upon Chmielowiec's private property. Everyone could clearly see that placement of any roads should not go in those areas. Yet, McLane has submitted a plat that places Redeemed and Shalom ingress and egress in such positions that drivers will have no choice but to trespass onto private land with no permission. Chmielowiec is currently trying to replat her property into 2 parcels for insurance and financing reasons. Chmielowiec is currently trying to work with KPB platting to resolve this issue but there has been no resolution at this point. The encroachment issue is preventing the approval. I am unsure why platting would support a plan that calls for trespass upon private property, e.g., Immanuel Subdivision.

The encroachment on DeBusk was documented by Chmielowiec's surveyor. It is unclear and unknown why McLane does not show the path of DeBusk and the encroachment.

To approve the plat as submitted would put the owners of the Immanuel Subdivision, David and Christina Hall, in territorial and potentially legal conflict with the owner of the property located on the opposite side of DeBusk, Susie Chmielowiec. None of the parties want that.

Narrow Road: The plat needs to accurately show the current location of the road.

Redeemed Road: The ingress and egress needs to be relocated such that it does not encroach on the private property across from it. Alternatively, the encroachment issue needs to be resolved between Chmielowiec and KPB platting.

Shalom Road: The ingress and egress needs to be relocated such that it does not encroach on the private property across from it. Alternatively, the encroachment issue needs to be resolved between Chmielowiec and KPB platting. Further issues with this road make it impractical. The road would have to be built over an existing pond or otherwise fully submerged portion of land. Additionally, there is a 30-40 foot cliff that extends from the current location of the end of Shalom Road to DeBusk. The high portion is on DeBusk. To tie those together at the location currently proposed in the plat would also encroach upon private property, again.

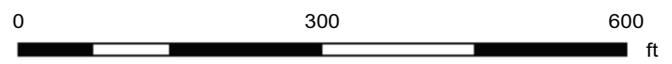

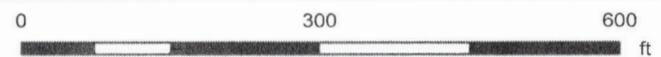

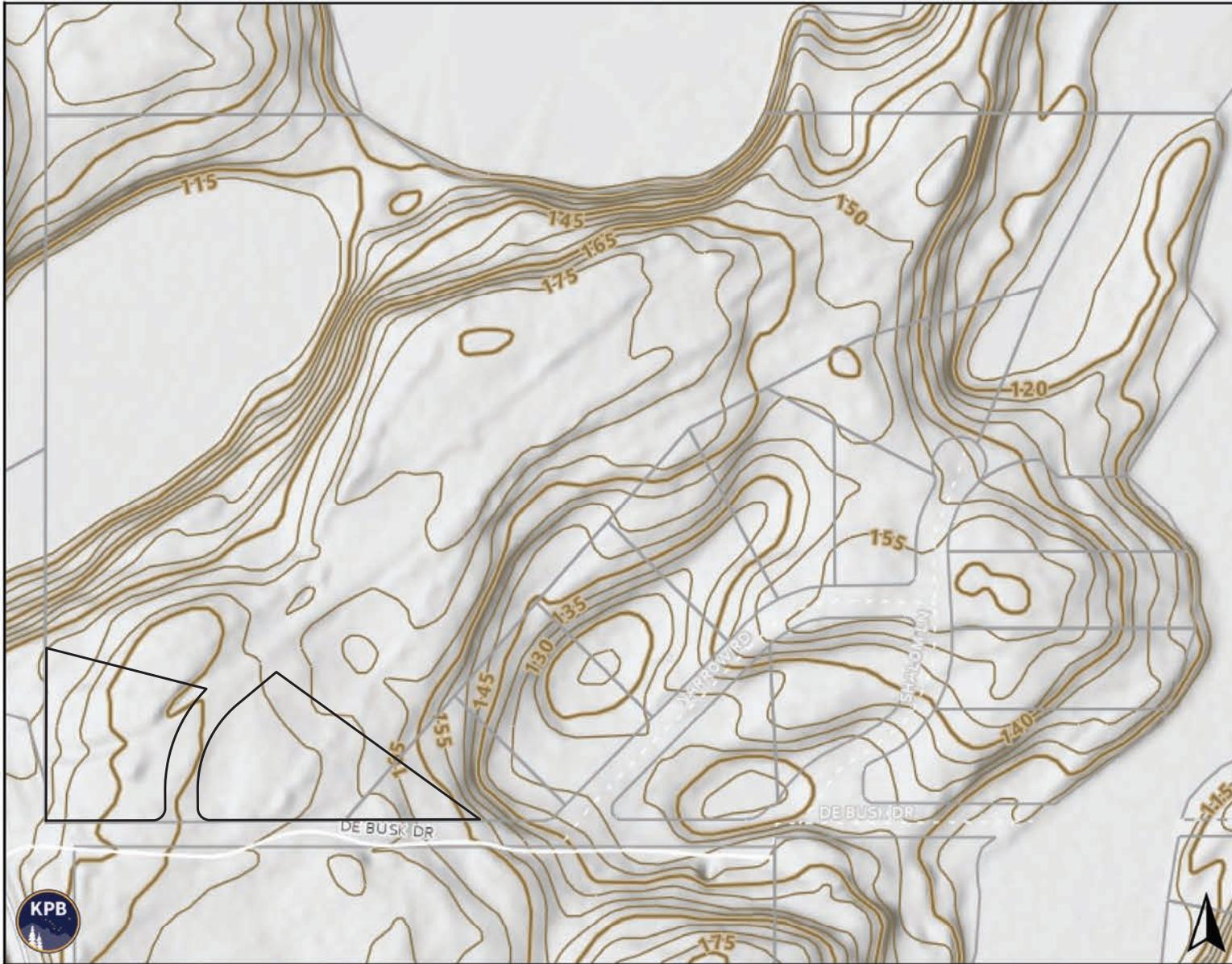

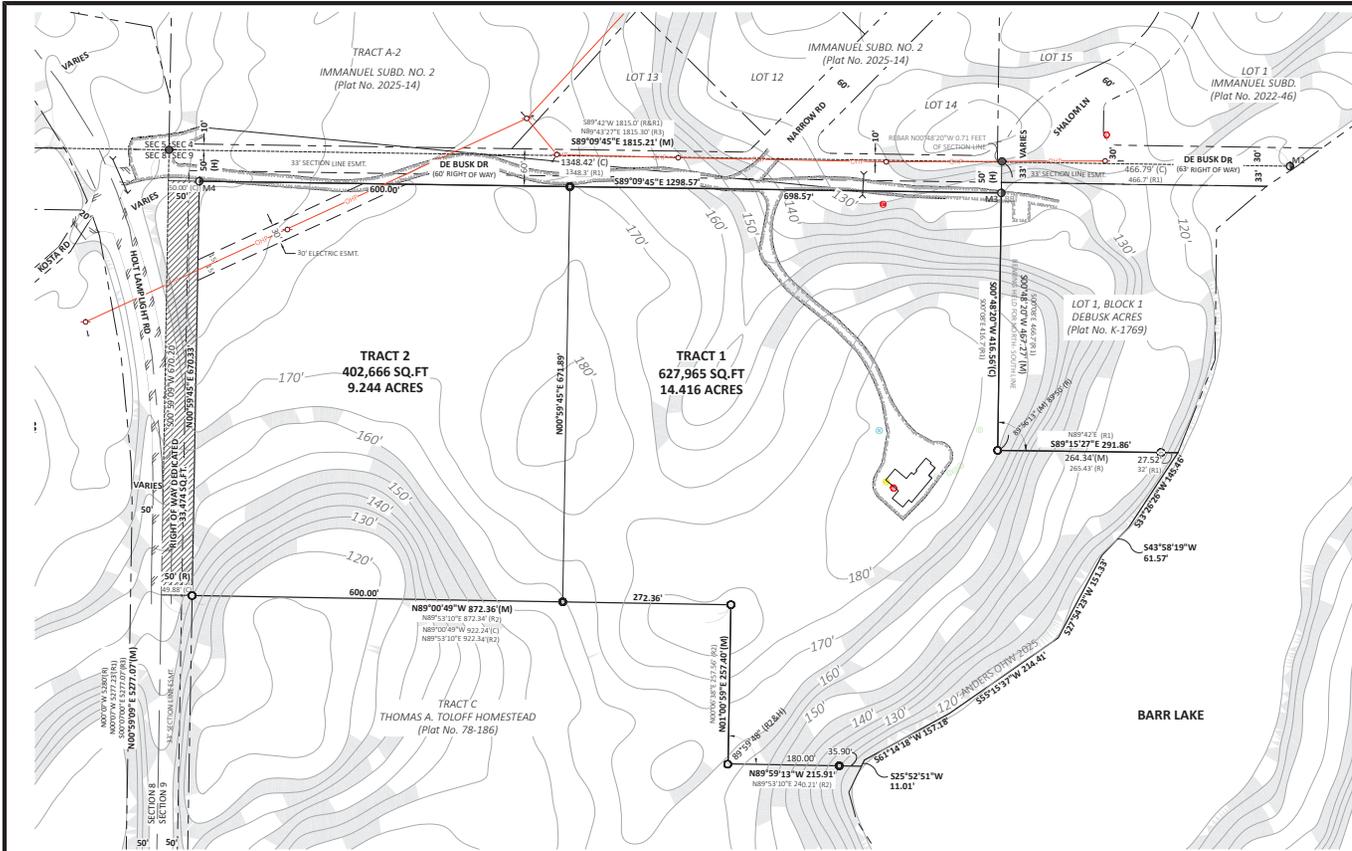

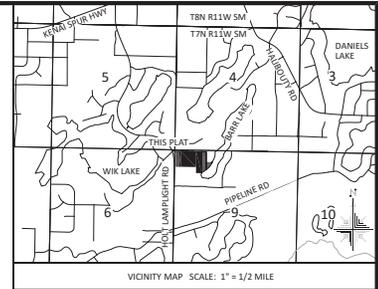
