Amend the ordinance title to read, "An Ordinance Amending KPB 2.54.060 to Refer Public Records Requests to the Borough Clerk [ATTORNEY] to Determine Whether the Records are Subject to Disclosure"; and

Amend the final whereas clause to read, "it is most appropriate for the borough clerk [LEGAL DEPARTMENT] to make these determinations as the clerk is required by Alaska Statute 29.20.380(a)(3) to assure that public records are available for public inspection as required by law [TO ENSURE THAT THE BOROUGH IS COMPLYING WITH STATE AND LOCAL LAW REGARDING PUBLIC RECORD REQUESTS];"; and

Amend Section 1 to read, "That KPB 2.54.060(B) is hereby amended as follows:

- 2.54.060. Response to requests for access to public records.
- B. Request for Records Exempt From Disclosure.
- 1. Where there is a question as to whether the information or records requested are exempt from disclosure, privileged or confidential, the request shall be referred to the borough attorney or designee [MAYOR] for a legal recommendation [DETERMINIATION] as to whether the material is subject to disclosure. The Borough Clerk shall make the final determination regarding disclosure after considering the advice of the borough attorney or designee.
- 2. If the information requested is determined to be exempt from disclosure, the person requesting the information shall be advised in [A] writing, stating the applicable law or rule of exemption, within 3 working days of receiving the request; such writing shall be signed by the Borough Clerk or designee. [DEPARTMENT OR DIVISION HEAD OR DELEGATE, OR THE MAYOR OR ADMINISTRATIVE OFFICER, IF APPLICABLE.]"

The amendment was approved unanimously.

Assembly Member Wolf stated he voted no on Ordinance 2014-38 because he felt whenever government speeds up processes, things tend to get messed up. Mr. Wolf announced that the Central Peninsula Bowling Team recently competed in Anchorage and won the state championship. He stated that his son was being deployed for six months and asked everyone to pray for all deployed military personnel. Mr. Wolf stated he was bringing forward legislation that would ask the voters in the 2015

Borough Election if they want to allow marijuana cultivation facilities in the borough.

Assembly Member Johnson stated he wanted to make sure it was clear that no specific group was going to receive the funding for the animal control ballot proposition. He wished everyone a happy new year.

Assembly Member Cooper stated she wanted to shake Jason Howard's hand and thank him for his military service.

Assembly Member Haggerty thanked Les Mofford, KPB Road Inspector, for his service on the south peninsula and congratulated him on his retirement. He stated he also wanted to thank Roberta Proctor for continuing her service with the Anchor Point Fire and Emergency Service Area Board. Mr. Haggerty stated he appreciated the sentiment behind Ordinance 2014-38, but he voted no because he personally experienced being on the public side of legislation and appreciated that the matter was not being rushed through the process. Mr. Bagley stated 2014 was a great year and 2015 was going to be better, as he predicted our iPad voting would work.
