Whereas, because residents outside of both the City of Seldovia and the current SKPHSA will be significantly affected by the outcome of this question, it is appropriate to make approval of this boundary change contingent upon the separate passage of this question by all three groups including this group of voters, the residents of the City of Seldovia, and the residents of the current service area;"

#### Amend Section 4 to read:

"Section 4. That section 1 of this ordinance shall take effect only upon <u>separate</u> approval of the proposition in section 2 by a majority of the voters [voting] in the existing <u>SKPHSA</u> <u>boundaries</u>, [and] <u>the voters in the proposed new boundaries of the service area <u>outside of both the city of Seldovia and the existing SKPHSA boundaries</u>, and the voters in the City of <u>Seldovia</u> during the regular KPB election scheduled for October 6, 2015. That sections 2, 3, 4 and 5 of this ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its enactment."</u>
