## CITY OF SELDOVIA **RESOLUTION 16-13**

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SELDOVIA TO SUPPORT THE CURRENT ALASKA STATE STATUTE 29.40.020(a) AND KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH CODE 2.40.010 IN REGARDS TO THE PROCESS OF ALLOCATION FOR PLANNING MEMBERS ON THE KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH PLANNING COMMISSION

WHEREAS, The City Council is a duly elected governing body of the City of Seldovia, a first class city, authorizing to act by and behalf of its citizens; and

WHEREAS, Seldovia has been a member of the Kenai Peninsula Borough Planning Commission since its inception; and

WHEREAS, The Kenai Peninsula Borough Planning Commission presently has 13 members, with the current borough code requirement (KPB 2.40.010) that each city have a representative on the planning commission, 15 members are needed to best comply with AS 29.40.020; and

WHEREAS, in an effort to not increase the Kenai Peninsula Borough Planning Commission number to comply with AS 29.40.020(a) the Assembly has proposed a reduction in the number of commissioners from cities thus combining Homer and Seldovia seats on the Borough Planning Commission; and

WHEREAS, Seldovia is concerned this change in legislation will cut or eliminate their presence on the KPB Planning Commission, consequently losing its voice for planning issues and topics that directly affect Seldovia and its residents; and

WHEREAS, Seldovia has an interest in all planning issues pertinent to the Kenai Peninsula Borough, and would like to maintain Seldovia's representation in planning issues on the peninsula; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the City Council of the City of Seldovia, Alaska supports the current AS 29.40.020(a) and Kenai Peninsula Borough Code 2.40.010 in regards to the process of allocation for planning members on the Kenai Peninsula Borough Planning Commission.
