What we've accomplished this past year

- 2700 linear feet of high-grade gravel surface
- Installed several new trees and rock features
 - larch, birch, elders, ash, lilac, lodge pole pine, hemlock, and blue spruce
- Five benches installed, created by Sid and Alex Cox
- Installed Christina Demetro's 6.5-foot-tall Peace Crane sculpture along with the dedication plaque.
- Laid 2400 cubic yards of soil along the edges of the trail
