




Perkins V Program Overview:

The requirements for a Perkins V program in Alaska all work together. Think of them as part of a continuous improvement cycle. These steps are also broken down into five Parts A-E that help to define how a district might think about needs, goals, plans and expenditures over time. The goal of a Perkins V program is to provide high quality, ongoing Career and Technical Education pathways for all students that are connected to local and regional industry and or in-demand, high-paying careers.

Data Review: Student Performance

Highlights: FY 21-22 School Year Data

- Graduation Rate of CTE Concentrators 96.5%
- Added 15 classes to our Perkins Reporting Data!
- Post Grad Placement 67% of CTE Concentrators
 - **2022-23** Focus Area classes participation grew:
 - CAD/CAM 77 students in FY22 and 100 in FY23
 - Work Based CoOp 34 students in FY22 and 58 in FY23
 - Construction 1 174 students in FY22 and 234 in FY23
- NonTraditional Program Concentration
 - 123 concentrators were non traditional gender group participants (Mostly in Construction & Human Services!) Still need to push other pathways.
- 2022-23 1286 CTE Credits earned / 113 students earned Postsecondary Credit / 88 Students completed work based learning

Areas of Focus:

- Number of CTE Concentrators was down across all pathways.
- **CTE Certifications** (268 for 22-23) still are not reporting accurately KPBSD reported 73 graduating seniors (CTE concentrators) had earned a Post Secondary credentials/certifications
- Work Based Learning & Post-Secondary credit didn't report correctly need to address with state & determine how to better report numbers.
 - 2022-23 KPBSD students earned 565 HS credits = 1695 college credits!





Students participating in middle college will retain their **"affiliate"** school enrollment **ie:** SoHi, KCHS, Homer High, RCA, etc




KENAI PENINSULA MIDDLE COLLEGE



Students apply for KPMC through the KPBSD website.



- Students must meet the eligibility requirements for Middle College:
 - High School 11th or 12th graders
 - 2.5 or higher GPA
 - Placement test into college level coursework
 - WRTG 111 <u>OR</u>
 - Math 105
- Participation in KPMCS Mentoring and Seminar course is required.

Current Enrollment:

2022-23 Numbers: 82 students / 1059 credits

Current MOA with KPC up to 150 students Districtwide.

Fall 2023:

92 Currently Enrolled / 596 credits

- 10 Eligible Chose not to take classes
- 60 Not Eligible
 - 32 didn't meet testing requirements
 - 25 didn't complete testing
 - 3 didn't meet testing deadline

** 22 students tested into WRTG 110 (If they take that class through KPC, they will be eligible for KPMC next semester).

**Students who have already applied, can fill out the first question on the application to reactivate their interest for Spring.

**KPC has 200+ Dual Enrollment students (JumpStart)

Student Support

- Mentoring & Seminar Course
- Partnership with KPC
- Paid tuition, books and fees
- **KPMC Orders books!** Students don't have to worry about finding the correct edition or format.
- **Transcripts** KPC sends final transcripts TO the KPBSD Coordinator, so classes are recorded accurately each term.

- Advising & Mentoring UNIV Class

Jump Start

- Discounted tuition

- Use Allotment to pay Jumpstart tuition rate & book cost
- Can choose to enroll in KPMC for Advising & Mentoring OR follow the JumpStart guidelines
- Work with Connections advisor to choose courses.


