Assembly Member Knopp reminded everyone to be careful driving on the icy roads.

Assembly Member Dunne apologized for not attending in person, but appreciated being able to attend via telephone and looked forward to seeing everyone at the next assembly meeting.

Assembly Member Ogle stated while the ongoing postponement of Ordinance 2014-32 had been frustraighting for all sides, he stated it was an example of the assembly not rushing int a decision and making sure there was a suitable outcome for all involved. He thanked Mayor Navarre for the providing a sales tax and property tax update, as well as for the health care task force update. Mr. Ogle stated there was several challenging things coming forward next year and looked forward to being involved.
