ASSEMBLY COMMENTS

Assembly Member Welles wished everyone a good evening.

Assembly Member Dunne congratulated the Homer Mariners Girl's Nordic Ski Team for winning the Small School's Division State Championship. He also congratulated Homer High School student, Nolan Bunting for receiving Drama Debate and Foresics Student of the Year award. Mr. Dunne reminded the assembly of the passage of Resolution 2016-009 supporting Senate Bill 23 relating to overdoses on opiod drugs and stated the Senate and House passed that bill, but were working out a few small differences before it goes to the Governor for signature. He stated while he thought SB23 was a small step; it did remove the legal barrier for the overdose drug Naloxone.

Assembly Member Ogle thanked the school board for the joint work session today and stated he learned a lot.

Assembly Member Cooper thanked the government students for attending the meeting. She stated it was a short meeting and encouraged them to attend another meeting to get the real sense of how the government process works.

Assembly Member Johnson reminded everyone of the public hearing meeting at Tustumena School 6:30 - 8:00 p.m. March 8, 2106 regarding the parking lot DNR and State Parks would like to build on the north side of the mouth of the Kasilof River. He stated public comments were being taken until March 21, 2016. Mr. Johnson stated he was honored to appear on the "Sound Off" radio show to talk about right-of-way clearing, which he indicated was more of a state matter. He stated he has heard both pros and cons of the right-of-way clearing on the Sterling Highway. Mr. Johnson stated he spoke to both Representative Seaton and Senator Micciche regarding the issue. He stated Senator Micciche was going to write a letter to Department of Transportation Commissioner Marc Luiken.
