END OF STAFF REPORT

Chairman Martin opened the meeting for public comment.

1. Matt Kelly, Kenai City Planner, 210 Fidalgo Ave, Kenai

Mr. Kelly was available to answer questions. He spoke about the hearing process that the City went through. There were a number of Town Hall meetings that were held at the Kenai Senior Center. Also there was a business meeting with the Chamber of Commerce and members of the business community that was held at the Kenai Visitors and Cultural Center. Those meetings were held on March 23, April 16, 21 and May 10, 2016. The Planning & Zoning Commission held a number of work sessions on May 17, 31 and June 23, 2016. They received public comments from the public on the comprehensive plan on July 13, 2016. He stated they worked with their consultant, Benson Planning Associates to make edits to the plan that came up as a result of those meetings. The plan was revised and brought to the City Council for approval. By Ordinance, the City Council approved the comprehensive plan and was recommending it to the Kenai Peninsula Borough. Mr. Kelly understood that the Kenai Peninsula Borough Assembly has introduced the ordinance and looking for the Borough Planning Commission recommendation. He stated that the Assembly will be holding a public hearing on January 3, 2016.

Chairman Martin asked if there were questions for Mr. Kelly. Hearing none the public hearing continued.

Seeing and hearing no one else wishing to speak Chairman Martin closed the public comment period and opened discussion among the Commission.
