

Background information

- Provide flood planning, protection and mitigation to service area residents
- Mill rate is .75 mills
- Staff of 2
 - Following resignation of Water Resource Manager, recommend reorganization of personnel to include:
 - Current administrative position proposed to increase from .75
 FTE to 1.00 FTE
 - Proposed to decrease administrative support position from .75
 FTE to .50 FTE

FY2017 Accomplishments

- US Army Corp of Engineers completed design to construct a flood control revetment for Salmon Creek
 - \$3.28 million total project cost, with 35% local funding match
 - Completed project will protect 54 residential homes valued at \$9.3 million
- Partnered with UAF for a mass wasting/sedimentation study for streambed change detection and hazard identification
- Partnered with City of Seward to complete a coastal erosion rip rap project
- Current mitigation projects include
 - Lost Creek Channel Maintenance
 - Box Canyon Creek WDS Restoration
 - Sawmill Creek Repairs





FY2018 Objectives & Budget Highlights

- Construction of a 1,500 foot flood control revetment and recreational area for Salmon Creek in partnership the US Army Corps of Engineers
- Establish benchmarks in high risk subdivisions for property owners to obtain lower cost Evaluation Certificates for the National Flood Insurance Program
- Obtain funding for sediment management plan
 - Removal of debris
 - Utilization of debris
 - Debris deposition areas
