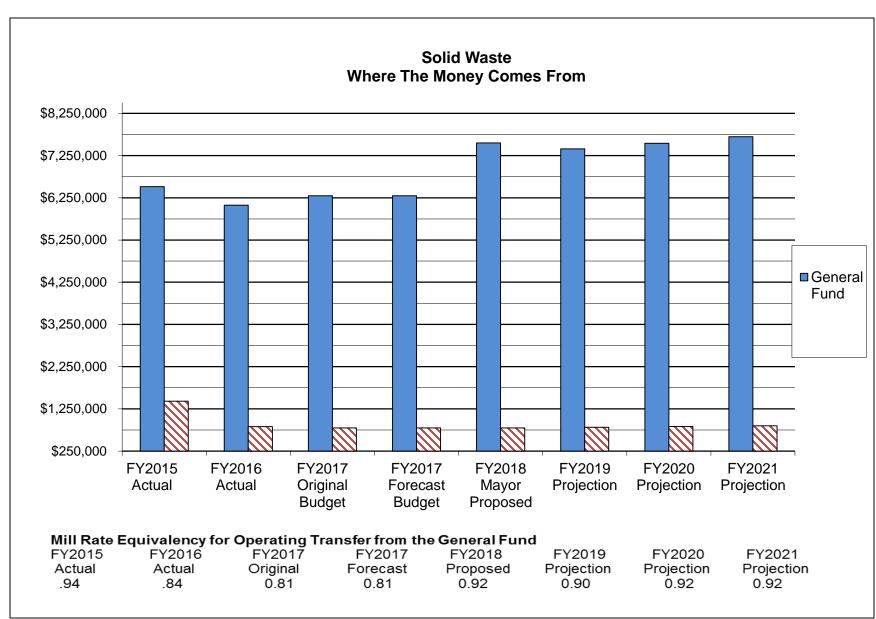

Background information, continued

- The proposed FY2018 budget for Solid Waste is \$8,761,416
 - Open daily May thru September
 - Closed on Sundays from October thru April
- Funding provided by:
 - General fund contribution, \$7,670,337, amount equal to approximately .97 mill
 - Fees \$800,000
- Staffing
 - Full time 15.50
 - Temps to help with 7 day a week service during summer



FY2017 Key Accomplishments

- Updated KPB special waste disposal policy
- Completed investigation of CPL land gas utilization options including:
 - Direct use on site in a landfill gas (LFG) fired boiler
 - Piping to CPL leachate evaporator and boilers and CPL to boiler at Skyview Middle School
 - Engine generator set at CPL (i.e. generate electricity) to include utilizing exhaust heat as an energy source for the leachate evaporator
- Upgrades to storm water control structures at CPL
- Implemented 6 day week for winter season
- Negotiated disposal agreement with City of Seward for management of waste water and decommissioned waster water holding pond
- Obtained ADEC Class III disposal permit for Nanwalek
- Renewed ADEC Class III disposal permit for Port Graham

FY2018 Objectives & Budget Highlights

- Complete Tyonek, Nanwalek, Port Graham long-term site development plans
- Begin cell 3 construction
- Begin phase 1 of C & D cell expansion project
- Develop Monofill expansion plan for Seward transfer facility
- Develop 5 to 7 year cover material acquisition plan for Homer transfer facility
- Provide rural community landfill operator training

Significant Budgetary Changes

- Debt service payment for cell 3, estimated amount \$1,075,871
- Capital project transfer of \$250,000
 - Development of C & D Cell, funding over 2 years
- Notwithstanding new debt service and C & D cell funding, department expenditures are down \$71,561

Long Term Issues & Concerns

- Develop master plan for CPL foot print and surrounding Borough property
- Planning for direct and indirect use of landfill gas at the Central Peninsula Landfill
- Long-term management of inert waste at the Homer and Seward Transfer Facilities
- Long-term solid waste management in communities where Borough does not own property for landfill development
- Flooding/road maintenance issue with Seward landfill access road
