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FY2017 Key Accomplishments

- Purchasing Administration:
 - Integration of Capital Projects into Purchasing (ord 2016-13 approved 6/7/2016)
 - Overall reduction in staffing of three positions
 - Merged administrative position to support both Purchasing and Capital Projects
 - Implemented and administered online auction process for disposal of surplus tangible property, which netted \$74,484, with another auction scheduled for the first week in May 2017.
 - Supported the Borough in the acquisition of approximately \$62 million dollars worth of goods and services, consisting of approximately 180 contracts.
 - Implemented phase 1 of e-bidding process that will provide increased efficiency in the department

FY2017 Key Accomplishments, continued

- Capital Projects:
 - Increase in efficiencies on contract administration and project reporting
 - Provided Land Management building and property evaluation support for property acquisitions
 - Reduction of staff to reflect reduction in number of projects

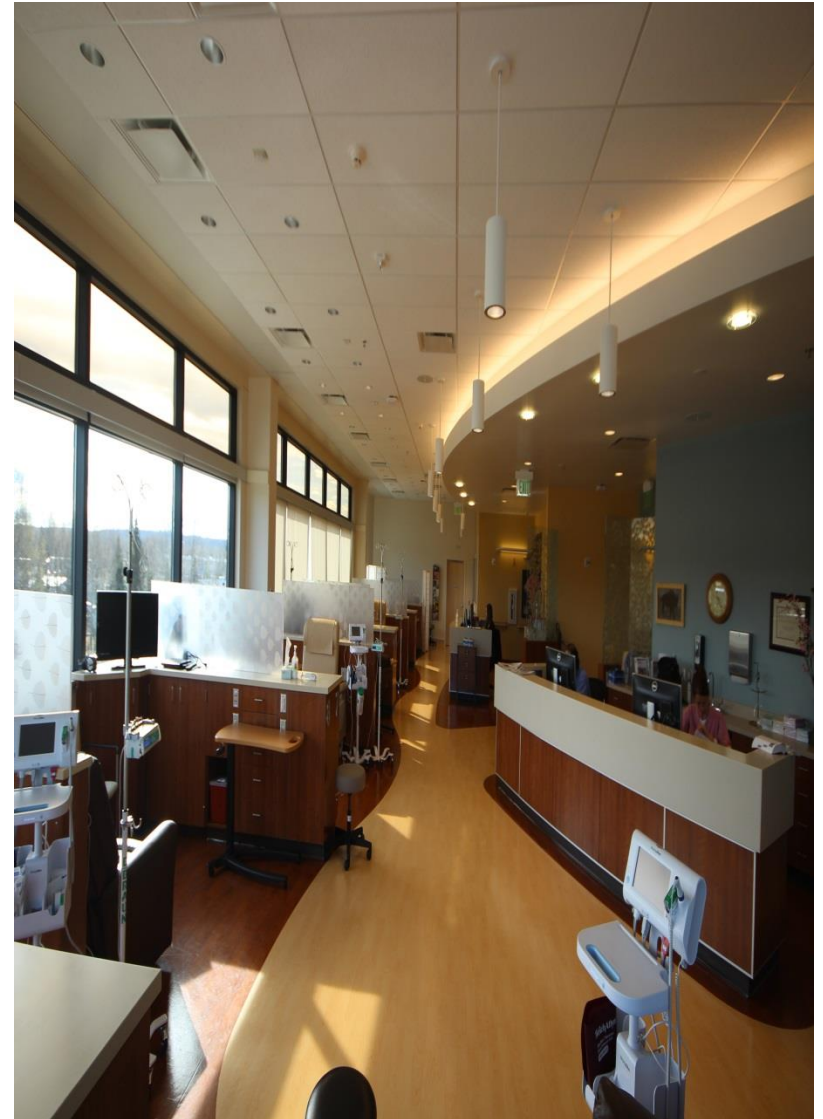
FY2018 Objectives and Budget Highlights

- Complete improvement of aligning efficiency in contracts and purchasing administration in combined department

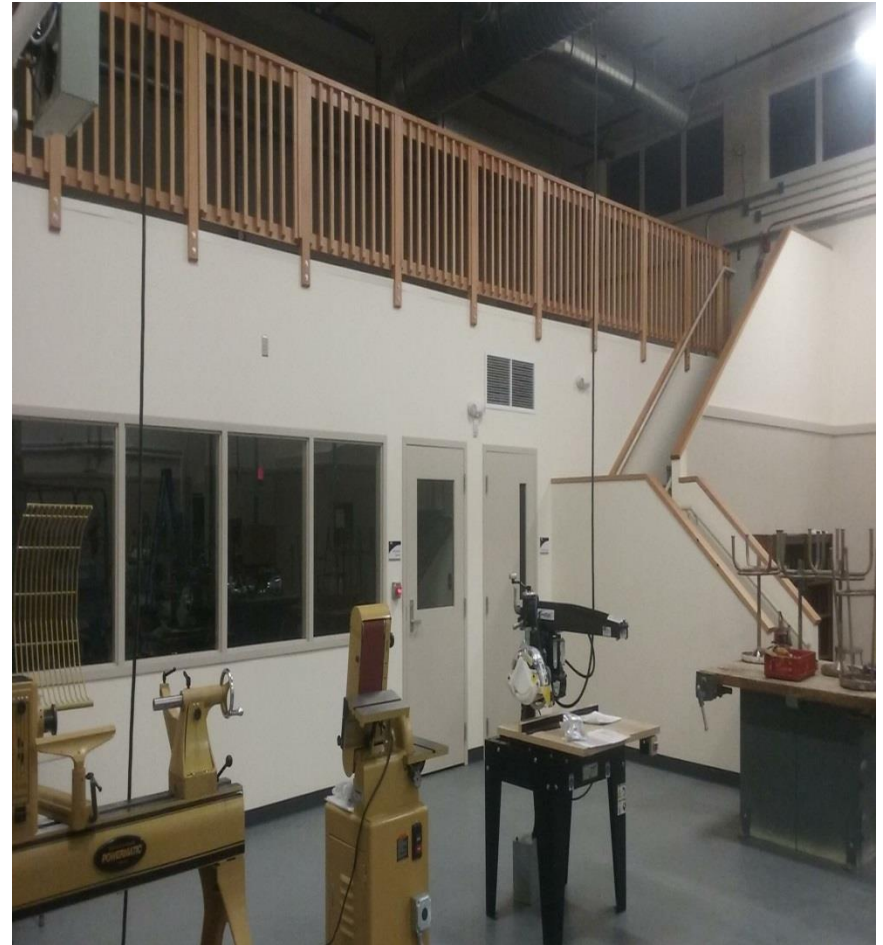

- Reduction in staff
 - Water resource manager, corresponding reduction in charges to other departments
