Significant Budgetary Changes

- Decrease in transportation/subsistence of \$69,425 due to change in canvas area – FY2017 was in Homer canvas area, FY2018 will be in the Anchor Pt., Clam Gulch, Kasilof, Ninilchik and Deep Creek areas
- Health care decrease of \$17,088
- Tersoro Refinery contract appraisal \$50,000

Long term concerns

- Unable to achieve a 5 year inspection cycle mandated by assembly resolution 2003-008; exploring technological solutions
- Increasing volume of data entry
 - Example, parcels with exemptions increased from 33,084 in FY2015 to 37,511 in FY2016
 - Number of parcels in the borough increases every year
- Changing ownership of software vendors; fewer vendors, less support
