

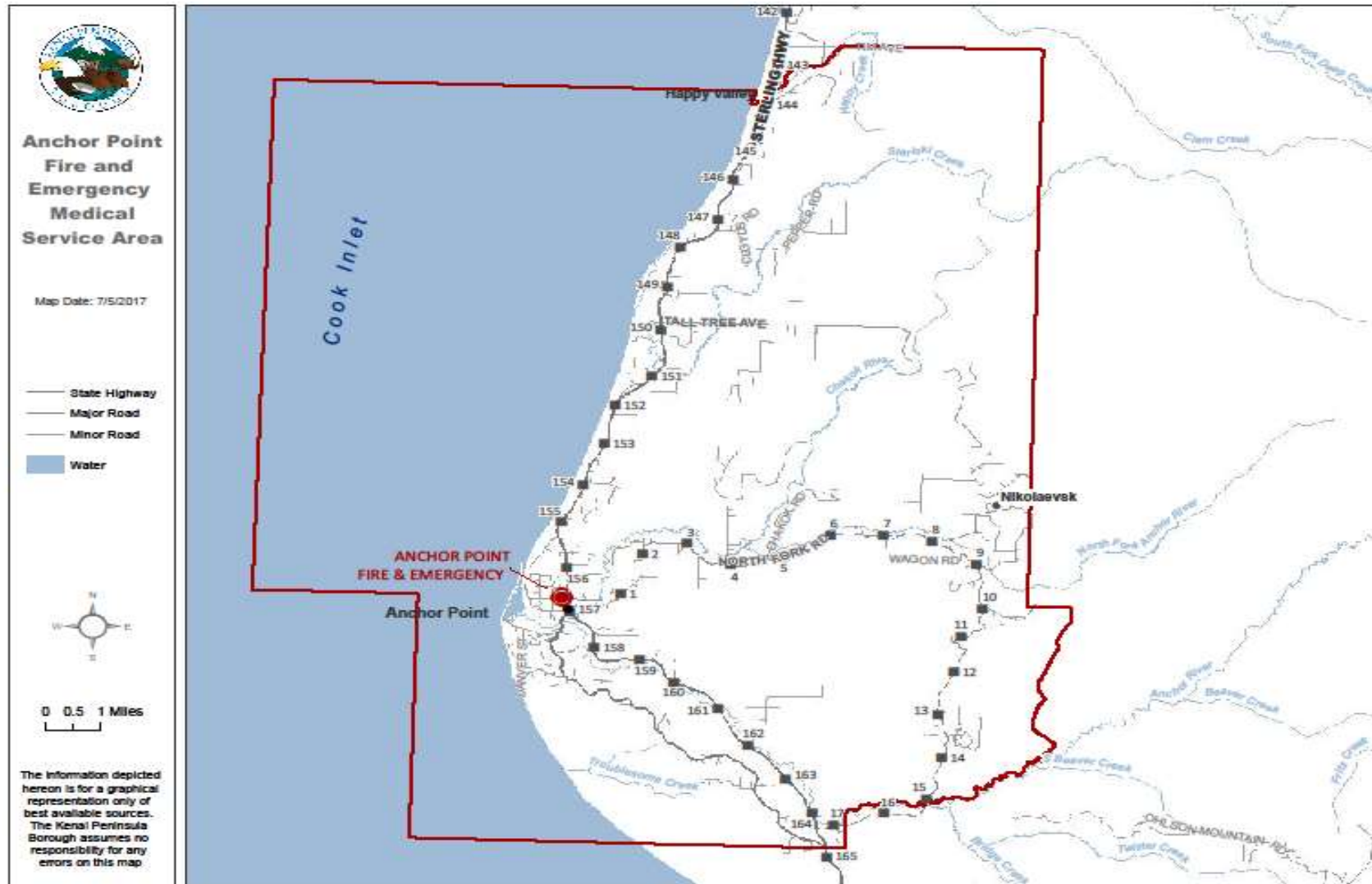


Anchor Point Service Area

- Secure funding for replacement of Self Contained Breathing Apparatus

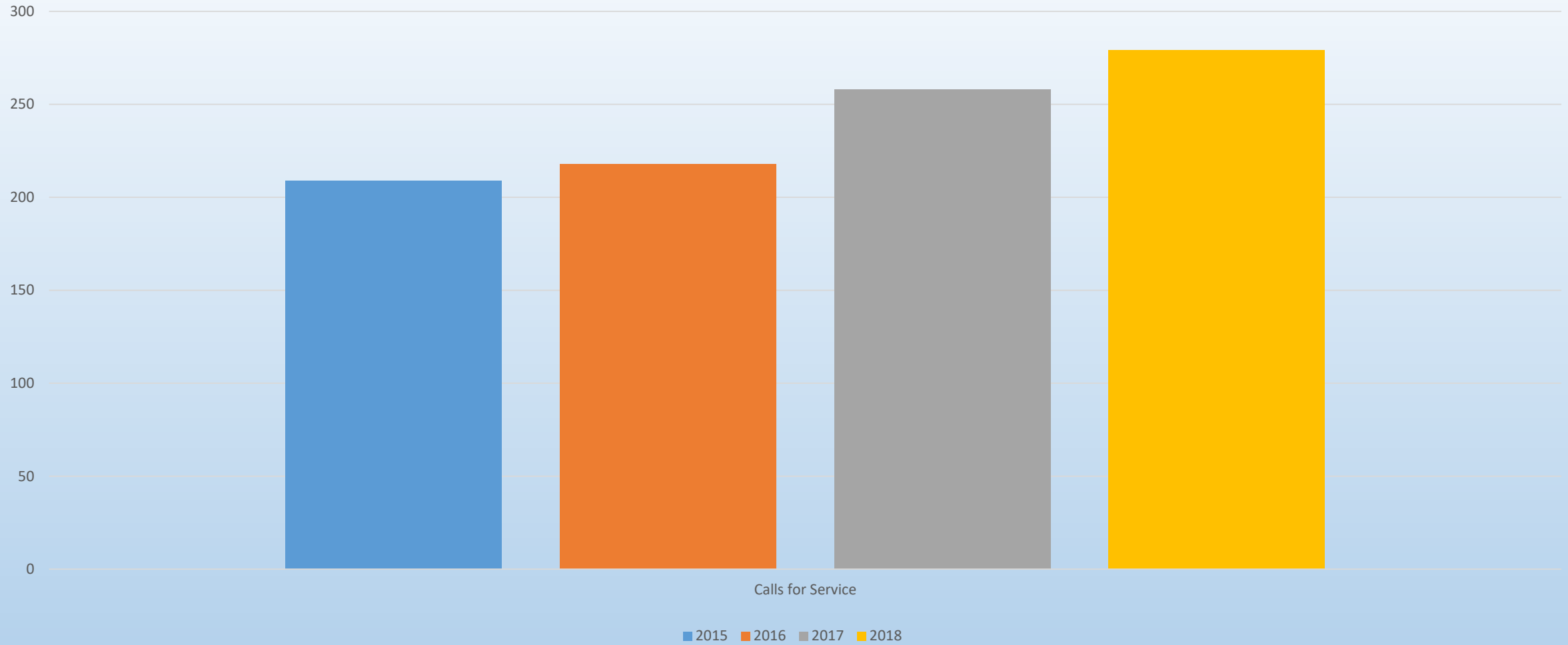


Challenges

- Uncertainty of tax revenue due to the State Budget crisis
- Loss of Oil/Gas Property Tax Revenue to the State would equal approximately 30% of our operating budget
- Possible closure of Chapman School. Tremendous loss to the Anchor Point community

Grant Funds Received Since 2014

- Alaska Department of Homeland Security
 - \$27,000 for hydraulic extrication equipment
 - \$104,000 for ALMR radios
- State of Alaska Department of Natural Resources, Division of Forestry
 - VFA grant in excess of \$62,500 for wildland and suppression equipment
- Southern Region EMS Council, Inc.
 - Code Blue funds in excess of \$70,000 for EMS equipment
