

History

In 1991 KPB Ordinance 91-32 Established the Central Emergency Service Area-by setting forth a reorganization plan by consolidation of the City of Soldotna Fire Department, Ridgeway/Sterling, K-Beach, and Central Peninsula EMS.

In 2004 areas of Kasilof and Funny River were admitted by voter approval to the CES Service Area.



FY 22 Budget

Mill Rate: 2.85 (no change)

- Personnel: Increase of 13.78%
 Added 3 Engineer/Paramedics, 1
 Training Staff, OT increase for
 Staffing Funny River Fire Station
 and Volunteer Training Programs
- Supplies: Increase 15.48%, in Medical Supplies (Funny River Amb.), Training Supplies, Foam
- Capital Outlay: Increase of 96.73%, Several one time purchases, Knox Key Secure System, Training Props, Off-Road Rescue Skid Unit, Hose rollers, Hose Pressure Tester











FY22 Capital Projects Fund

- ► Fire Station Relocation/Design/Construction: \$1,000,000
- ► Ambulance Purchase: \$260,000
- ▶ Radio Communications, PILT Grant: \$192,500
- ► EMS Advanced Training Simulators: \$130,000
