# ASSEMBLY COMMENTS

Assembly Member Bagley stated he appreciated that the Assembly President was trying to be fair with the prayer issue; however, felt it was ironic that the invocation given was nothing but a political statement and if a pastor was here making a similar political statement, we would not be letting them back.

Assembly Member Dunne thanked the organizers and participants of Salmon Fest in Ninilchik, as it was a successful event.

Assembly Member Cooper stated the Governor was in Homer last week and held a community meeting with the city council. She stated it was a very informative meeting and hoped that he was also making time to meet with the borough mayor and assembly.

Assembly Member Johnson stated if a hospital service area was being formed today for South Peninsula Hospital and Central Peninsula Hospital, he was certain that the line would be put past the highway mid-way point. He stated it was an unfair practice for the residents in that area to keep the line were it was and hoped that this was not the end of the matter. Mr. Johnson stated to South Peninsula Hospital: "let my people go."

President Gilman stated that the assembly recevied public comments regarding the importance of religous liberty. He stated that what that means was, as a political body, we may have to listen to different religious views that we do not agree with and hoped as this progressed that more people would use this opportunity to promote prudent and wise decisions of the assembly and not use it to make political statements. Mr. Gilman stated that the public comments received were pretty clear that they did not want the invocation banned and this was what living in democracy was. He encouraged everone to relax and stated that things would calm down on the invocation front and we could move forward.
