Dear Mr. Smith:

The Borough received your May 12, 2022, appeal of the Borough's Intent to Award a contract to Alaska Scrap and Recycling ("the Bidder") for the West Region, Unit 6 Summer and Winter Road Maintenance. The purpose of this letter is to provide my decision on your appeal.

You raised six reasons for the appeal which I have reviewed and which are summarized as follows:

- 1. That the Bidder committed a bid error by submitting their bid on page 2 of 2 of the bid form for Unit 5.
- 2. The instructions to bidders for item 10 states, in part, "only the amounts and information asked for on the Bid Schedule will be considered as the bid. Each bidder shall bid upon the work exactly as specified and as requested on the Bid Schedule" and because of this the Bidder did not bid the work exactly as specified.
- 3. The Bidder did not properly acknowledge the Addendums issued for this project.
- 4. Incorporation of Bid documents into the contract creates a dilemma for KPB: 1) KPB drafts a contract for West Region, Unit 6 using the Bidder's bid using a West Region, Unit 5 Bid form; or 2) KPB asks the Bidder to submit a revised bid using the West Region, Unit 6 Bid Form; or 3) KPB creates its own copy of West Region, Unit 6 Bid Form using the Bidder's numbers. Any of those choices would constitute falsification of documents and a fraudulent contract.
- 5. KPB failed to notify D&L Construction or any other contractors of the bid error.

6. Confusion regarding the Bidder's business license.

Summary of Decision on Appeal

Reason 1: References to Section 10 are noted and bidders should be aware of complications that may lead to a rejection of their bid. Section 13 Acceptance – Rejection of Bids, states that, "The Borough reserves the right to reject any or all bids, **to waive minor irregularities in any bids or in the bidding procedure, and to accept any bid presented which meets or exceeds said specifications and which is deemed to be in the best interest of the Borough.** Please see KPB Code of Ordinances, section 5.28.240 – Waiver of irregularities, emphasis added.

In this instance the Bidder mistakenly submitted sheet two of the bid form on the Unit 5 page 2 of 2. The signature page of this bid was appropriately submitted on sheet 1 of 2 for Unit 6. The Bidder's intention is clearly indicated by their submission and signature on the bid form for Unit 6, page 1 of 2. It is also important to note that the Bidder stated their intention to submit a bid for Unit 6 at the bid opening, immediately upon the reading of their bid.

Reason 2: The pages 2 of 2 in the ITB for all three Units' bid forms are identical with the exception of the noted Unit in the title block on each sheet. The Bid Schedule on the Unit 5 bid form page 2 of 2 is exactly the same as the bid schedule on the Unit 6 bid form page 2 of 2 and would not alter the values in any way.

Reason 3: Based on the recommendation of the Purchasing and Contracting Director, it is reasonable to assume that three check boxes on the Bid Form for Unit 6 serve to acknowledge the Bidder's acceptance of the three addendums issues for this ITB. All addenda will be included in the contract documents upon award.

Reason 4: This is acknowledged as a minor irregularity. Clarification of the intent will be addressed through the contract award process.

Reason 5: On May 6, 2022, at 2:44 pm, and prior to the intent to award, the Purchasing and Contracting Director responded to a request from D&L Construction about the ITB22-044 bid opening (attached). The body of the email stated the following;

"Upon further review of the bid documents the signature page of the bid was in fact for Unit 6. The error was in the use of the bid sheet for Unit 5. That bid sheet is identical to the Unit 6 sheet in format and does not alter the value provided. It was apparent through the signature page and the response from the contractor at the bid opening that the intent was to submit a bid for Unit 6. This is a minor irregularity and is not cause for finding Alaska Scrap and Recycling's bid nonresponsive."

This email also included a copy of the Bid Form pages 1 of 2 and 2 of 2, for reference.

As such, the Borough did respond to D&L regarding the minor irregularity in the bid process. All other claims under this Section are addressed in the explanations above.

Reason 6: The Bidder currently operates three other Roads Service Area Winter and Summer Maintenance contracts under the licensing provided in the bid tab. No discrepancies with that existing licensing status are known to exist at this time.

Therefore, for the reasons stated, your appeal is denied. The decision to award this contract to Alaska Scrap and Recycling is upheld pending inspection and ability to fully comply with the requirements of the contract. March 18, 2022.

This denial constitutes a final action by the Mayor and is appealable to the Borough assembly pursuant to KPB 5.28.320(G). A copy of KPB 5.28.320 is attached to this decision. Pursuant to KPB 5.28.320(G), if you decide to appeal this decision to the assembly you must submit your appeal to the borough clerk in writing within three (3) business days of the date of this decision.

Dear Mayor Pierce,

In accordance with the KPB Code of Ordinances 5.28.320 we hereby appeal the **INTENT TO AWARD** dated May 9, 2022 to Alaska Scrap & Recycling for the Invitation to Bid – ITB 22-044 Summer & Winter Maintenance, West Region, Unit 6.

D & L Construction Co., Inc. was the lowest, qualified, responsive and responsible bidder for this project and should be awarded the contract for the following reasons:

- 1) Alaska Scrap & Recycling did not submit a bid for West Region, Unit 6 regardless of their stated intent after the bid opening. Page 2 of 2 as evidenced by their bid was for West Region, Unit 5 (see attached). They committed a bid error and should not have been declared the low bidder for West Region, Unit 6. Alaska Scrap & Recycling should not be allowed to benefit from their bid error at the expense of other bidders. The Instructions to Bidders, Item 10, states, in part, "Bids may be rejected if they show any omissions, alteration of the forms, additions not called for, conditional or alternate bids not called for, qualified bids, or irregularities of any kind." The Alaska Scrap & Recycling bid omitted the proper Bid Form, page 2 of 2 and therefore constituted an irregularity of the magnitude such that their bid should have been (be) declared nonresponsive for West Region, Unit 6. This contract should be awarded to D & L Construction Co., Inc.
- 2) The Instructions to Bidders, Item 10, states, in part, "Only the amounts and information asked for on the Bid Schedule will be considered as the bid. Each bidder shall bid upon the work exactly as specified and as requested on the Bid Schedule ..." Alaska Scrap & Recycling did not submit a bid with the amounts and information asked for on the Bid Schedule for West Region, Unit 6. Alaska Scrap & Recycling did not bid upon the work exactly as specified and as requested on the Bid Schedule for West Region, Unit 6 therefore their bid is nonresponsive and should have been (be) declared as such. This contract should be awarded to D & L Construction Co., Inc.

- 3) Alaska Scrap & Recycling did not properly acknowledge the Addendums issued for this project. Three Addendums were issued (see attached) prior to bid opening and they should have been acknowledged on the Bid Form, page 1 of 2, as such; i.e., 1, 2 & 3. Instead they appear to have been acknowledged as X X X (see attached). There were no X X X Addendums. Any subsequent contract entered into after award that changes the X X X Addendums to 1, 2 & 3 will not represent the bid as submitted and any changes to reflect the actual Addendums 1, 2 and 3 will constitute the falsification of documents and be fraudulent. This contract should be awarded to D & L Construction Co., Inc.
- 4) Any contract awarded pursuant to the KPB INTENT TO AWARD dated May 9, 2022 to Alaska Scrap & Recycling creates a dilemma for the KPB. One of two things will have to take place. The KPB may draft a contract using the Alaska Scrap & Recycling bid, in which case, a contract will be awarded for West Region, Unit 6 using a West Region, Unit 5 Bid Form. This will in effect create a fraudulent contract. On the other hand the KPB could request Alaska Scrap & Recycling to submit a revised bid using the West Region, Unit 6 Bid Form or the KPB could simply create their own copy of the West Region, Unit 6 Bid Form using the Alaska Scrap & Recycling numbers. In either case, this will constitute not only the falsification of documents but will again create a fraudulent contract. D & L submitted the lowest responsive bid and no falsification of documents or fraud would be involved in awarding them the contract for West Region, Unit 6.
- 5) The construction industry standard requires a fair and open competitive bidding process. The KPB failed in their duty to formally disclose the Alaska Scrap & Recycling bid error for West Region, Unit 6. The KPB did not notify D & L or, to the best of our knowledge, any other contractors, of the bid error. D & L was informed of the bid error by another bidder who was present at the bid opening. This conduct on behalf of the KPB is totally unacceptable and creates a very dangerous precedent for the KPB and all contractors who bid on KPB projects in the future. There appears to be a total lack of integrity on the part of the KPB when it comes to bid openings. KPB Purchasing & Contracting published a false and fraudulent bid tabulation for the West Region, Unit 4, 5 and 6 when they posted the Alaska Scrap & Recycling bid as being for West Region, Unit 6 when it was submitted on the Bid Form for West Region, Unit 5. Withdrawing the INTENT TO AWARD to Alaska Scrap & Recycling for the West Region, Unit 6 contract and awarding the contract to D & L will restore the integrity to this bid opening.
- 6) And finally, there is some question as to whom the KPB would be contracting with if they award this contract to Alaska Scrap & Recycling. Alaska Scrap & Recycling, LLC (1008882) does have a business license (982866) with an address of 720 E Whitney Road Anchorage, Alaska 99501 and a contractor's license (CONE38698) DBA S & R Enterprises (an involuntarily dissolved Alaska business corporation) with an Anchorage, Alaska address. However, the bid submitted by Alaska Scrap & Recycling for West Region, Unit 5 contains two different addresses. The Bid Form, page 1 of 2, has an address of 42462 K Beach Road (which according to KPB records is owned by SAS LLC) Soldotna, Alaska 99669 and the Tax Compliance Certification submitted has an address of 720 E Whitney Road Anchorage, Alaska 99501. The address at 42462 K Beach Road Soldotna, Alaska 99669 shows Alaska Scrap and Recycling as well as Peninsula Scrap & Salvage Co (another involuntary dissolved Alaska business corporation). This contract should be awarded to D & L Construction Co., Inc. who has maintained the same address in the KPB for nearly forty years.

Based upon all the reasons stated above we hereby request that the NOTICE OF AWARD to Alaska Scrap & Recycling for the Invitation to Bid – ITB22-044 Summer & Winter Maintenance West Region, Unit 6 be withdrawn and that the contract be awarded to D & L Construction Co., Inc.



What is even worse is if I had not been in the room during the bid opening the Borough would have been able to quietly and secretly sweep this under the rug with D&L, the real low bidder, being none the wiser. I feel for Alaska Scrap, I really do. Any contractor that has been doing this any length of time has made mistakes on bids and had to live with it. It is part of the business.

I really hope D&L does not let this precedent stand without a fight. I will gladly stand by their side in this and give my first hand testimony in court or to the media or however they see fit to pursue this. Regardless the public needs to know that this is how the Borough currently conducts business. I think most voters would be as appalled as I am.



SINCE IT IS RARELY POSSIBLE TO DISCERN WHAT WAS IN THE MINDS OF THE BIDDERS, ISN'T IT JUST AS REASONABLE TO ASSUME THAT AS&R SUBMITTED THE WRONG BID FORM, I.E., SHEET 1 OF 2 FOR CENTRAL UNIT 6? IS THE DIRECTOR OF PURCAHSING A MIND READER? THE MAYOR GOES ON TO SAY THAT THE AS&R REPRESENTATIVE AT THE BID OPENING "...STATED THEIR INTENTION TO SUBMIT A BID FOR UNIT 6, IMMEDIATELY UPON THE READING OF THEIR BID." STATEMENTS MADE AT THE BID OPENING ARE TOTALLY IRRELEVANT. A FAIR AND REASONABLE COMPETITIVE BID OPENING IS NOT AND SHOULD NOT BE BASED ON A STATED "INTENT". THE ERROR THAT THE KPB ACKNOWLEDGES (SEE EMAIL DATED, FRI, MAY 6, 2022 AT 2:44PM FROM JOHN HEDGES TO LARRY SMITH) COUPLED WITH HIS SUBSEQUENT RECONSTRUCTION AND INTERPRETATION OF SAID ERROR CONSTITUTES CORRECTING A MATERIAL DEFECT OF AN OTHERWISE NON-RESPONSIVE BID. AS CONTRACTORS WE HAVE A DUTY TO BID ACCURATELY, PROMPTLY AND IN CONFORMITY WITH THE INVITATION TO BID (AND ACCOMPANYING ADDENDUMS). ALASKA STATUTORY LANGUAGE (AS SEC. 36.30.170) REQUIRES CONFORMITY IN"...ALL MATERIAL ASPECTS TO THE REQUIREMENTS AND CRITERIA SET OUT IN THE INVITATION TO BID." BY CORRECTING THE AS&R BID ERROR OR INTERPRETING A PATENT AMBIGUITY OF A MATERIAL ELEMENT IN THEIR FAVOR THE PURCHASING DIRECTOR ELEVATED WHAT SHOULD HAVE BEEN A NON-RESPONSIVE BID TO A RESPONSIVE BID THEREBY PREJUDICING FAIR COMPETITION. THE AS&R BID WAS NOT IN CONFOMITY WITH THE INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS AND / OR THE THREE ADDENDUMS ISSUED PRIOR TO THE BID DATE AND TIME. AS A RESULT THE AS & R BID SHOULD HAVE BEEN DECLARED NON-RESPONSIVE. AS&R SHOULD NOT BE REWARDED FOR SUBMITTING A BID IN ERROR NOR SHOULD THE OTHER BIDDERS AND SPECIFICALLY D & L BE PENALIZED WHEN SUBMITTING THEIR BIDS IN CONFORMANCE WITH THE REQUIREMENTS AND CRITERIA SET OUT IN THE INVITATION TO BID.

THE KPB RELEASED ITB22-044 SUMMER & WINTER ROAD MAINTENANCE, WEST REGION 4, WEST REGION 5 AND WEST REGION 6 ON APRIL 6, 2022. THESE DOCUMENTS INCLUDE SEVEN PAGES OF INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS WHICH SPECIFY THE FORM AND PROCEDURES FOR THE SUBMISSION OF A COMPLETE AND ACCEPTABLE BID. THESE DOCUMENTS ALSO INCLUDED A SEPARATE BID FORM, PAGES 1 AND 2, FOR EACH OF THESE THREE REGIONS. THE KPB RECEIVED TWO RESPONSIVE BIDS (D & L AND RIVER CITY CONSTRUCTION) FOR WEST REGION 6 AND ONE NON-RESPONSIVE BID (ALASKA SCRAP &

RECYCLING). THE NON-RESPONSIVE BID INCLUDED THE BID FORM, PAGE 1 OF 2, FOR WEST REGION 6 AND THE WRONG BID FORM, PAGE 2 OF 2, FOR WEST REGION 5. AND THE NON-RESPONSIVE BID MARKED THREE X'S ON THE BID FORM INSTEAD OF THE NUMBERS 1, 2 AND 3 IN THE ADDENDA ACKNOWLEDGEMENT PORTION OF THE BID FORM.

THE INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS, ITEM 10. PREPARATION AND SUBMISSION OF BIDS STATES, IN PART, "BIDS MAY BE REJECTED IF THEY SHOW ANY OMISSIONS, ALTERATION OF THE FORMS, ADDITIONS NOT CALLED FOR, CONDITIONAL OR ALTERNATE BIDS NOT CALLED FOR, QUALIFIED BIDS OR IRREGULARITIES OF ANY KIND." SUBMITTING THE WRONG BID FORM IS CERTAINLY AN IRREGULARITY. THIS ITEM GOES ON TO SAY THAT "THE BID SCHEDULE INVITES BIDS ON DEFINITE PLANS AND SPECIFICATION." SUBMITTING A BID FORM, PAGE 1 OF 2, FOR WEST REGION 5 DOES NOT MEET THE CRITERIA OF BIDDING ON DEFINITE PLANS AND SPECIFICATIONS; THIS ONLY MAKES THE BID INCOMPLETE, INDEFINITE AND AMBIGUOUS.

THREE ADDENDUMS WERE ISSUED FOR THIS PROJECT; ADDENDUM NO. 1 DATED APRIL 7, 2022, ADDENDUM NO. 2 DATED APRIL 21, 2022 AND ADDENDUM NO. 3 DATED MAY 3, 2022. ALL OTHER BIDS SUBMITTED PROPERLY ACKNOWLEDGED THESE THREE ADDENDUMS (1, 2 & 3). THE NON-RESPONSIVE BID ONLY MARKED THE BID FORM WITH THREE X'S. THIS IS NOT STANDARD INDUSTRY PRACTICE AND DOES NOT MEET THE REQUIREMENTS OF THE BID FORM. THIS IMPROPER ACKNOWLEDGEMENT OF THE ADDENDUM'S SHOULD HAVE DEEMED THE ALASKA SCRAP & RECYCLING BID NON-RESPONSIVE.

FOR ALL OF THE REASONS SET OUT ABOVE WE AGAIN HEREBY REQUEST THAT THE KPB ASSEMBLY REMAND THIS MATTER BACK TO THE MAYOR WITH A RECOMMENDATION THAT THE CONTRACT BE AWARDED TO D & L.

I feel for Alaska Scrap, I really do. Any contractor that has been doing this any length of time has made mistakes on bids and had to live with it. It is part of the business.

I really hope D&L does not let this precedent stand without a fight. I will gladly stand by their side in this and give my first hand testimony in court or to the media or however they see fit to pursue this. Regardless the public needs to know that this is how the Borough currently conducts business. I think most voters would be as appalled as I am.

INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDER

GENERAL:

These instructions specify the form and procedures for the submission of a complete and acceptable bid. (See Bid Form/Schedule.)

In an effort to make the solicitation process more efficient and cost effective for both vendors and the agency, the Kenai Peninsula Borough has adopted an electronic bidding process for Invitations to Bid and Requests for Proposal. Electronic bids/proposals may be submitted at the <u>BidExpress.com</u> website as the primary method of bid/proposal submission. For a limited time, paper bids/proposals will continue to be accepted, but it is strongly recommended vendors become familiar with the electronic process as soon as possible to prepare for future plans to only accept electronic bids/proposals.

2. EVIDENCE OF QUALIFICATIONS:

Upon request of the Owner, a Bidder whose Bid is under consideration for the award of the Agreement shall submit promptly to the Owner satisfactory evidence of the Bidder's financial resources, their experience, their performance in completing other projects of a similar nature, and the organization and equipment they have available for the performance of the Agreement.

3. BIDDER QUALIFICATIONS:

Before the Bid is considered for award, the Purchasing and Contracting Director reserves the right to determine whether or not a Bidder is responsible and to require the Bidder to complete a Bidder Qualification Form and/or a current financial statement prepared by a Certified Public Accountant. The Purchasing and Contracting Director shall determine whether a Bidder is responsible on the basis of the following criteria:

- The skill and experience demonstrated by the Bidder in performing Agreements of a similar nature.
- The Bidder's record for honesty and integrity.
- The Bidder's capacity to perform in terms of facilities, personnel, and financing.
- The Bidder's past performance under Borough Agreements. If the Bidder has failed in any material way to perform its obligations under any Agreement with the Borough, the Bidder may be determined as a non-responsible Bidder.
- A Bidder's representations concerning their qualifications will be construed as a covenant under the Agreement. Should it appear that the Bidder has made a material misrepresentation, the Borough shall have the right to terminate the Agreement for the Contractor's breach, and the Borough may then pursue such remedies as provided in the Contract Documents or as provided by state statute, borough code, or as appropriate.

6. **LICENSING**

Section 43.70.020 of the Alaska State Statutes requires that all businesses wishing to engage in business in Alaska obtain a license. 7. **TAX COMPLIANCE CERTIFICATE**

8. LOCAL PREFERENCE

9. INTERPRETATION OR CORRECTIONS OF BID DOCUMENTS

Bidders shall notify the Purchasing and Contracting Director promptly of any error, omission, or inconsistency that may be discovered during examination of the Bid Documents and the proposed work site. Requests from Bidders for interpretation or clarification of the Bid Documents shall be made in writing to the Purchasing and Contracting Director and shall arrive no later than 5.00 PM on April 18, 2022. Oral questions may be presented at a pre-bid conference if one is provided for in the Bid Documents. Interpretations, corrections, material substitution requests or changes, if any, to the Bid Documents shall be made by Addendum. Bidders shall not rely upon interpretations, corrections, and changes made in any other manner, including orally, at the pre-bid conference. Interpretations, corrections, and changes shall not be binding unless included in an Addendum. All Addenda issued during the time of bidding shall become part of the Agreement Documents. Questions or requests for clarifications shall be directed to the Borough's Purchasing and Contracting Director. Questions or requests for clarification directed to any other member of the Borough staff may be grounds for rejection of the bid as being irregular. However, the requirements for timeliness and manual

ARTICLE 1 THE WORK

The Contractor shall perform all the work required by the Contract Documents for the project: KENAI PENINSULA BOROUGH ROAD SERVICE AREA, SUMMER & WINTER ROAD MAINTENANCE, WEST REGION, UNITS 4, 5, & 6.

ARTICLE 2 TIME OF COMMENCEMENT AND DURATION

The services under this Contract shall commence on the date indicated by the Owner on the written Notice to Proceed (the "Effective Date") and shall terminate on June 30, 2025. The Contract may be renewed for TWO additional yearly terms, at the sole option of the Owner. A notice of extension signed by the Owner shall be executed on or before June 1, if the renewal option is exercised. Renewal terms shall commence July 1 and terminate June 30. Total contract terms, including the initial term and all renewals, shall not exceed five (5) years.

ARTICLE 3 CONTRACT SUM & PAYMENT

The Owner shall pay the Contractor based on the unit prices and lump sum prices as provided in Attachment B. The Owner does not represent or warrant that all the basic services pay item units used for the estimate on Attachment B will be required. The total amount paid to the Contractor under this Contract may not be the same as the total estimated amount. The total Contract compensation paid under this Contract shall not exceed for any single contract year. Contractor shall invoice Owner on a monthly basis with such invoice setting forth a description of the services provided and reasonable documentation to support any charges thereon. Invoices

ARTICLE 6 INFLATION ADJUSTMENT

The bid price of the Contract will be adjusted each fiscal on or around March 1st to account for inflation. The inflation adjustment will be based upon the annual percentage change in inflation for the previous year based upon the U.S. Department of Labor statistics for Anchorage, Alaska and will not commence until the first full calendar year of the contract.

ARTICLE 7 NO THIRD PARTY BENEFICIARY

This Contract is intended solely for the benefit of each party hereto. Nothing contained herein shall be construed or deemed to confer any benefit or right upon any third party.

ARTICLE 8 COUNTERPARTS

PART III CONTRACT CONDITIONS

General Conditions

- 1.8 <u>Knowledge</u>. The term "knowledge," "recognize," and "discover," when used in the Contract Documents in reference to Contractor, shall mean that the Contractor knows (or should know), recognizes (or should recognize), and discovers (or should discover) in exercising the care, skill and diligence required by the Contract Documents.
- 1.9 <u>Modification</u>. A modification is a written amendment to the Contract signed by both parties or a change order issued by the Owner.
- 1.10 <u>Notice to Proceed</u>. A written notice to the Contractor to begin the Work and establishing the date on which the Contract Time begins.
- 1.11 Owner. The Kenai Peninsula Borough.
- 1.12 <u>Reasonably Inferable</u>. The term shall mean reasonably inferable by a Contractor familiar with Road Maintenance Services and exercising the care, skill, and diligence required of the Contractor by the Contract Documents.
- 1.13 <u>Subcontractor</u>. A person or entity who has a direct contract with the Contractor to perform a portion of the Work or provide a portion of the necessary equipment or supplies.
- 1.14 <u>Work</u>. The term "work" means the Road Maintenance Services required by the Contract Documents, whether completed or partially completed, and includes the result of performing or providing, all necessary equipment, materials, supplies, tools, freight, labor, supervision, and transportation provided or to be provided by the Contractor to fulfill the Contractor's obligations. The Work may constitute the whole, or part.

ARTICLE 2 CONTRACT DOCUMENTS

- 2.1 The Contract Documents shall be signed by Contractor within ten (10) calendar days after receipt from Owner. At the sole discretion of Owner, if signed Contract Documents are not received within ten (10) calendar days, Owner may award the contract to the next highest scoring proposer.
- 2.2 By executing the Contract Documents, Contractor represents that it has inspected the road maintenance unit ("the site") and familiarized itself with the local conditions under which the Work is to be performed and with the scope of work required by the Contract Documents. Contractor shall bear any losses arising from its failure to inspect the site or failure to determine conditions affecting the Work and ascertainable by reasonable inspection or inquiry to Owner.
- 2.3 Should any provision or requirement of the Contract Documents conflict with any other, the conflict will be resolved by reference to the Contract Documents in the following order of priority:
 - A. The most recent version of the Contract or modification thereto:

- road inspector shall be assigned to the road maintenance unit and shall be made known to Contractor.
- 3.2 Owner will make periodic visits to the road maintenance unit to inspect the work and to determine, in general, if the work is proceeding in accordance with the Contract Documents. Based on such observations of the work and on communication between Contractor and Owner, Owner will evaluate Contractor's invoices for payment.
- 3.3 Owner and/or Owner's Representative will have authority to reject work which does not conform with the requirements of the Contract Documents and to require such remedial work, as is necessary to make the work conform to the Contract requirements.
- 3.4 The Road Service Area Director, or their designee, will decide all questions which may arise as to
 - a. Quality and acceptability of materials furnished;
 - b. Quality and acceptability of Work performed;
 - c. Compliance with any the schedule of progress;
 - d. Interpretation of Contract Documents;
 - e. Acceptable fulfillment of the Contract on the part of the Contractor.
- 3.5 The Road Service Area Director and/or his designee, may make visits to the site(s) and any approved storage sites at intervals appropriate to the various stages of road maintenance services to observe the progress and quality of the executed Work and to determine, in general, if the Work is proceeding in accordance with the Contract Documents. The Road Service Area Director or designee may, at reasonable times, inspect that place of business of the Contractor or Subcontractor that is related to the performance of the Contract. Such observations or the lack of such observations shall in no way relieve the Contractor from its duty to perform the Work in accordance with the Contract Documents.

ARTICLE 4 CONTRACTOR

- 4.1 The services to be rendered under the Contract are those of an independent contractor. Contractor is not an officer, employee, or agent of Owner. The Contractor shall not make representations otherwise and shall not represent it has authority to incur any liabilities on behalf of the Owner. The Owner shall not supervise or direct the Contractor except as set forth in the Contract Documents.
- 4.2 The means, methods, techniques, sequences or procedures of Road Maintenance, or safety precautions and the program incident thereto, and the failure to perform or furnish the Work in accordance with the Contract Documents are the sole responsibility of the Contractor.
- 4.3 Contractor shall supervise and direct the Work, using its professional skill and attention.

 No additional compensation shall be paid to Contractor for additional work required

the person's race, religion, color, or national origin, or because of the person's age, sex, marital status, sexual orientation, pregnancy, parenthood, or disability if the individual, with reasonable accommodation, is qualified to perform the essential functions of the job. Contractor agrees to post in conspicuous places, available to employees and applicants for employment, notices setting forth the provisions of this nondiscrimination clause. Contractor further agrees to insert this provision in all subcontracts hereunder and to require the subcontractors to insert this provision in their subcontracts. Contractor shall comply with AS 18.80.220, any amendments thereof and applicable federal law regarding equal employment practices.

- 4.13 The Contractor shall keep fully informed of all federal and state Regulatory Requirements and all orders and decrees of bodies or tribunals having any jurisdiction or authority, which in any manner affect those engaged or employed in the Work, or which in any way affect the conduct of the Work. The Contractor shall at all times observe and comply with all such Regulatory Requirements, orders and decrees; and shall protect and indemnify the Kenai Peninsula Borough and its representatives against claim or liability arising from or based on the violation of any such Regulatory Requirement, order, or decree whether by the Contractor, Subcontractor, or any employee of either. Except where otherwise expressly required by applicable Regulatory Requirements, the Owner shall not be responsible for monitoring Contractor's compliance with any Regulatory Requirements.
- 4.14 Contractor shall pay for all royalties and license fees. Contractor shall defend all suits or claims for infringement of any patent rights and shall save Owner harmless from loss on account thereof. This requirement does not lessen the requirement for indemnification stated in Article 9.1.

ARTICLE 5 SEPARATE CONTRACTS

- 5.1 Owner reserves the right to award other contracts in connection with other portions of road maintenance or improvement work in the road maintenance unit.
- 5.2 Contractor shall afford other contractors or other persons authorized by Owner reasonable opportunity for the execution of their work. Contractor shall properly coordinate its work with other contractors of Owner.
- 5.3 Any costs caused by defective, ill-timed, or untimely work shall be borne by the party responsible thereof and shall be paid promptly.

ARTICLE 6 SUBCONTRACTORS

6.1 A subcontractor is a person or entity having a direct contract with Contractor or Contractor's subcontractor to perform any of the work under these Contract Documents.

Subcontractors must be approved, in writing, by Owner prior to subcontractor's commencing work.

a) Workers' Compensation Insurance:

Contractor and subcontractor(s) of any tier shall provide and maintain, for all of its employees engaged in work under this Contract, Workers' Compensation Insurance in accordance with the laws of the State of Alaska. The Contractor shall be responsible for Workers' Compensation Insurance for any subcontractor(s) who directly or indirectly provides services under this Contract. This coverage must include statutory coverage for states in which employees are engaging in work and employer's liability protection not less than the minimum amounts required by law. Where applicable, coverage for all federal acts (i.e., U.S.L. & H and Jones Act) must also be included. Subrogation shall be waived.

b) Comprehensive or Commercial General Liability Insurance:

Contractor and subcontractor(s) of any tier shall provide and maintain, Commercial General Liability Insurance (CGL). The CGL Policy shall be written on an occurrence basis and with a limit of not less than **ONE MILLION AND NO/100 DOLLARS** (\$1,000,000.00) each occurrence and aggregate. CGL insurance shall be written on standard ISO occurrence form (or a substitute form providing equivalent coverage) and shall cover liability arising from premises, operations, broad form property damage, independent contractors, products-completed operations, personal injury and advertising injury, explosion, collapse, underground hazards, and liability assumed under a contract including the tort liability of another assumed in a business contract. If necessary to provide the required limits, the Commercial General Liability policy's limits may be layered with a Commercial Umbrella or Excess Liability policy. To the extent damages are covered by commercial general liability insurance, subrogation shall be waived. The Kenai Peninsula Borough shall be named as an "Additional Insured" under all liability coverage listed above.

c) Automobile Liability Insurance:

Contractor and subcontractor(s) of any tier shall provide and maintain, Auto Liability Insurance (ALI). The Auto Liability Policy shall include a Combined Single Limit of not less than ONE MILLION AND NO/100 DOLLARS (\$1,000,000.00); Underinsured and Uninsured Motorists limit of not less than ONE MILLION AND NO/100 DOLLARS (\$1,000,000.00); Coverage shall include Non-Owned and Hired Car coverage. This policy shall name the KPB as Additional Insured. To the extent damages are covered by auto liability insurance, subrogation shall be waived.

d) Excess Liability:

If necessary to provide the required limits, required policy limits may be layered with a Commercial Umbrella or Excess Liability policy or policies. This policy shall name the KPB as Additional Insured and waiver of subrogation language shall be included.

e) Personal Property:

If applicable, Contractor and subcontractor(s) of any tier shall purchase insurance to cover any personal property used in performance of the contract. In no event shall the

8.8 Owner, at its option, may purchase and maintain such insurance as will protect Owner against property losses or liability claims, which may arise from operations under the Contract. Insurance providing coverage against fire and extended coverage perils, may at Owner's option, provide coverage to the full insurable value of the project and insure the interests of Contractor and all subcontractors as their interests may appear. Any recovery for loss insured pursuant to this Article is to be adjusted to Owner and made payable to Owner as trustee for the insured, as their interests may appear. This section does not modify Contractor's or subcontractors' responsibility to provide insurance as required in Article 9.

ARTICLE 9 INDEMNIFICATION

- 9.1 To the fullest extent permitted by law, the Contractor shall defend, indemnify and hold harmless the Owner, its agents and employees from and against claims, damages, losses, and expenses, including, but not limited to, attorney's fees, arising out of or resulting from performance of the Work, either by Contractor or any of its Subcontractors. Such obligation shall not be construed to negate, abridge, or reduce other rights or obligations of indemnity which would otherwise exist as to a party or person described in this paragraph.
- 9.2 The Contractor shall not be required to defend or indemnify the Owner for any claims of, or liability for, any wrongful or negligent act, error, or omission solely due to the independent negligence of the Owner. If there is a claim of, or liability for, the joint negligence of the Contractor and the independent negligence of the Owner, the indemnification and hold harmless obligation shall be apportioned on a comparative fault basis. Apportionment shall be determined upon final determination of percentage of fault. If any such determination is by settlement, the percentage of fault attributed to each party for purposes of this indemnification provision shall only be binding upon the parties included in the settlement agreement.
- 9.3 "Contractor" and "Owner" as used in this Article include the employees, agents, officers, directors, and other contractors who are directly responsible, respectively, to each. The term "independent negligence of the Owner" does not include alleged negligence in the Owner's selection, administration, monitoring, or controlling of the Contractor and in approving or accepting the Contractor's work.
- 9.4 In claims against any person or entity indemnified under paragraph 9.1 by an employee of the Contractor, a subcontractor of any tier, anyone directly or indirectly employed by them or anyone for whose acts they may be liable, the indemnification obligation shall not be limited by a limitation on amount or type of damages, compensation or benefits payable under workers' compensation acts, disability benefit acts or other employee benefit acts.

proceed to correct such defective Work. Owner shall follow-up with written notice of the work done and attempts at communication within ten (10) calendar days of the event. All direct, indirect and consequential costs of the Owner in exercising such rights and remedies shall be charged against the Contractor, and the Owner shall be entitled to an appropriate decrease in the Contract Price.

ARTICLE 11 CHANGES IN THE WORK

11.1 CHANGES

- 11.1.1 Changes in the Work may be accomplished after execution of the Contract, and without invalidating the Contract, by Change Order subject to the limitations stated in this Article 11 and elsewhere in the Contract Documents.
- 11.1.2 Changes in the Work shall be performed under applicable provisions of the Contract Document, and the Contractor shall proceed promptly, unless otherwise provided in the Change Order. A change in the Contract Sum or the Contract Time shall be accomplished only by Change Order. Accordingly, no course of conduct or dealings between the parties, nor express or implied acceptance of alterations or additions to the Work, nor any claim that the Owner has been unjustly enriched by any alteration or addition to the Work, shall be the basis of any claim to an increase in any amount due under the Contract Documents in any time period provided in the Contract Document.

11.2 CHANGE ORDERS

- 11.2.1 A Change Order is a written instrument prepared by the Owner and signed by the Contractor, stating their agreement upon all of the following:
 - 11.2.1.1 A change in the Work. Upon identification of a change of condition, the Contractor shall promptly notify the Owner and provide a detailed written description of the change of conditions. Such notification shall occur within no more than 48 hours of the discovery of the change in condition.
 - 11.2.1.2 The amount of the adjustment in the Contract Price, if any. The Contractor shall include any adjustment to Contract Price with the written description provided in 11.2.1.2 and shall detail the reasons for the adjustment in price. The adjustment requested shall include supporting backup for values provided an d breakdown identifying labor, equipment and material qualities and values.
 - 11.2.1.3 The extent of the adjustment in the Contract Time, if any shall be estimated by the Contractor and included in the Change in Work document.
- 11.2.2. Agreement on any Change Order shall constitute a final settlement of all matters relating to the change in the Work which is the subject of the Change Order, including, but not limited to, all direct and indirect costs associated with such change and any and all adjustments to the Contract Sum.

markup. The materials must be preapproved and incorporated into the work. The Contractor shall furnish to the Owner's Representative proof of payment for materials used in the work plus any applicable transportation charges. For Contractor-produced materials, Contractor must certify, in writing, its Contractor's actual direct cost.

- **11.3.3.3** <u>Equipment.</u> Includes machinery and special equipment (other than small tools) necessary for the work and authorized by the Owner's Representative . No additional compensation will be made for overhead, profit, maintenance, service, repairs, fuels, lubricants, or replacement parts.
- a) <u>Hourly Rental Rate</u>. Based on rental rates in the current edition and appropriate volume of the *Rental Rate Blue Book*, by EquipmentWatch, Penton Media, Inc..

The regular hourly rental rate is equal to the equipment rate plus the estimated hourly operating cost. These rates apply for equipment used during the Contractor's regular shift of ten (10) hours per day. No markup is allowed.

The equipment rate is equal to the age adjusted monthly rate for the basic equipment plus the age adjusted monthly rate for applicable attachments, both divided by 176, and multiplied by the regional adjustment factor. The equipment rate is per hour.

The age adjusted monthly rate is that resulting from application of the age adjustment formula, to eliminate replacement cost allowances in machine depreciation and contingency cost allowances.

Only the attachments required for the time and materials work will be included.

- b) Hourly Overtime Rate. Half of the equipment rate plus the full estimated hourly operating cost. The overtime rate will apply to hours the equipment is used in excess of ten (10) hours per day, either on the Contractor's normal work or on time and materials, and either on single or multiple shifts. No markup is allowed.
- c) <u>Hourly Stand-by Rate</u>. Half of the equipment rate, for equipment ordered on stand-by during the Contractor's normal work shift, not to exceed eight hours per day. No operating costs or markup is allowed.
- d) <u>Unlisted Equipment</u>. For equipment not listed in The Blue Book, the Contractor and the Engineer may agree to a rate before extra work is begun. If agreement is not reached, the Engineer has authority to establish a rate based on similar equipment in *Rental Rate Blue Book* or prevailing commercial rates. No markup is allowed.
- e) <u>Leased or Rented Equipment</u>. Equipment that must be rented or leased specifically for work required under this section and authorized in writing by the Owners representative shall be paid at invoice price plus 15 percent markup.

Payments to Contractor will be withheld on account of (1) defective work not remedied, (2) claims filed, (3) failure of Contractor to make payments properly due to subcontractors or suppliers, (4) damage to another contractor, (5) damage to Owner's property, (6) unsatisfactory execution of the work by Contractor; or (7) untimely or delayed execution of the work by Contractor.
- 12.3 <u>Termination for Cause</u>. If Contractor defaults or neglects to carry out the work in accordance with the Contract Documents, or fails to perform any provision of the Contract, Owner, without prejudice to any other remedy Owner may have, may make good such deficiencies and may deduct the cost thereof from the payment then or thereafter due the Contractor. Owner, at its option, after ten (10) days' written notice to Contractor, may terminate the Contract.
- 12.4 Examples of occurrences creating a breach of contract and justifying termination for cause include, but are not limited to events where the Contractor:
 - a. Fails to begin the Work under the Contract within the time specified in the Notice to Proceed, or
 - Fails to perform the Work in accordance with the Contract Documents (including, but not limited to, failure to supply sufficiently skilled workmen, or failure to supply suitable materials or equipment), or
 - c. Performs the Work unsuitably or neglects or refuses to remove materials or to correct Defective Work, or
 - d. Discontinues the prosecution of the Work, or
 - e. Becomes insolvent, except that if the Contractor declares bankruptcy termination in accordance with all U.S.C. 362 and/or 11 U.S.C. 365. In the event the Contractor declares bankruptcy the Contractor agrees that the Contract will be assumed or rejected in a timely manner so that the Contract will be completed by the date specified in the Contract Documents, or
 - f. Allows any final judgment to stand against him unsatisfied for period of sixty (60) calendar days, or
 - g. Makes an assignment for the benefit of creditors without the consent of the Owner, or
 - h. Disregards regulatory requirements of any public body having jurisdiction, or
 - Otherwise violates in any substantial way any provisions of the Contract Documents, or
 - j. For any cause whatsoever, fails to carry on the Work in an acceptable manner, the Owner may give notice in writing to the Contractor of such delay, neglect, or default.
- 12.5 All time requirements stated in the Contract Documents are of the essence. If Contractor fails to complete the work within the time required by the Contract Documents, then Owner shall have the right, but not the obligation, to contract with another party to

- 12.10 <u>Termination Due to Non-Availability of Government Funds</u>. If the Owner's Assembly fails to appropriate sufficient funds or fails to authorize the expenditure of funds to continue services under this Contract, the Owner shall, as soon as practical, submit written notice to Contractor terminating this Contract, and releasing Contractor, and any subcontractors, from their obligations therein. Such notice shall be in writing and shall be sent not less than thirty (30) calendar days prior to the date of termination. The notice shall include a written statement documenting the reason for termination and an official document certifying the non-availability of funds (e.g. Assembly Action, official budget or other official Owner document). Termination for non-availability of government funds shall not be deemed to be a breach of this Contract by the Owner. In the case of termination under this section, Contractor shall be entitled to receive just and equitable compensation for any satisfactory work completed prior to termination.
- 12.11 Non-Waiver of Rights. The failure of the Owner at any time to enforce a provision of the Contract Documents shall in no way constitute a waiver of the provisions, nor in any way affect the validity of the Contract or any part thereof or the right of the Owner thereafter to enforce each and every provision of the Contract Documents. A term or condition of this Contract may be waived or modified only by written consent of both parties. Forbearance or indulgence by either party in any regard shall not constitute a waiver of the term or condition to be performed, and either party may evoke any remedy available under the Contract or by law despite such forbearance or notice.

END GENERAL CONDITIONS

Scope of Work

1. SCOPE OF SERVICES

- **1.1.General.** Provide suitable equipment and perform all the services to accomplish the required road maintenance as set forth under this Contract.
- 1.2. Contractor's Responsibility to Monitor. It is the responsibility of the Contractor to monitor the condition of all the roads in the unit and respond without callout at all times. During ongoing or anticipated snow and ice events, all roads shall be monitored to ensure compliance with the contract.
- **1.3. Accessibility.** Maintain communication between the Borough and the Contractor at all times. Office to be located within the Kenai Peninsula Borough. Telephone, fax, and cell phones will be local numbers.

Contractor shall submit daily work reports, on a form provided by the owner, that includes all work performed on each road. Forms shall be submitted to the owner every Friday.

Maintain a manned phone with texting capabilities

Maintain a functioning e-mail address.

Maintain contact with your home office to retrieve messages.

When an RSA Inspector requests to be called the call must be returned within the hour

Maintain communications with all working equipment.

Maintain continuous communication during any critical events or occurrence (i.e.

Snowstorms, icing conditions, avalanches, floods, heavy rains, earthquakes, forest fires, etc.).

1.4. Unit Roads. Linear footage shown are for those roads currently accepted for maintenance by the Road Service Area Board. The list is subject to change within the Road Service Area at the sole discretion of the Borough. If the list changes, the mileages will change accordingly. The Contract price will be adjusted to reflect the

additional work that results there from is not part of this Contract. An emergency situation exists when the Borough Mayor or higher authority, declares a "State of Emergency" that encompasses the Road Service Area. In the event of an Emergency, continue to perform work under this Contract unless ordered by authorities to cease.

3. RESPONSE TIME

- 3.1. Contractor is required to submit a management and safety plan. Contractor's management and safety plan shall describe the system of controls and supervision that the contractor plans to implement, in order to ensure that the operations in the unit(s) are efficient, effective, and concurrent. Contractor's management and safety plan shall address the coordination of contractor's forces, so that each operational unit experiences adequate response to each call-out on a timely basis.
- **3.2.** Work shall begin within the required response time. Response time for summer maintenance shall be no more than 24 hours after trigger point has been reached or called out by the owner. Response time for winter maintenance shall be no more than 4 hours after the trigger point has been reached or call-out by owner.
- **3.3.** Under extreme conditions, as defined herein, response time may be reduced. Extreme conditions shall include severe snowstorm, rainstorm, flooding, wind, or other condition extreme enough to cause exceptional safety problems on roads within the service area. Determination that extreme conditions exist shall be at the Owner's sole discretion. Call-out response time for extreme conditions shall be no more than four (4) hours in summer and two (2) hours in winter.
- **3.4.** If the Contractor fails to comply with the specific response times that are citied in this Contract, the Borough may bring in another contractor to perform the work. This cost will be deducted from the monthly billing amount

4. EVIDENCE OF QUALIFICATIONS:

- **4.1.General.** Upon request of the Owner, a Proposer whose proposal is under consideration for the award of the Agreement shall submit promptly to the Owner satisfactory evidence of the Proposer's financial resources, their experience, their performance in completing other projects of a similar nature, and the organization and equipment they have available for the performance of the Agreement.
- **4.2. Proposer Qualifications:** Before the Proposal is considered for award, the Purchasing and Contracting Director may determine whether or not a Proposer is responsible and may require the Proposer to complete a Proposer Qualification Form and/or a current financial statement prepared by a certified public

6.0 MINIMUM EQUIPMENT REQUIREMENTS

The Contractor shall provide and maintain equipment suitable for this work. All specified equipment shall be in safe working condition, comply with all state and federal standards, and ready for immediate service under all weather conditions.

6.1 Winter Equipment

Contractor shall supply equipment capable performing winter maintenance services as defined in the scope of work.

Contractor shall provide a minimum of one working sander per unit. Each sander shall have a minimum 5 cubic yard capacity or two (2) 2.5 cubic yard capacity sanders per unit.

Contractor shall keep all equipment in good working condition and shall be able to respond to icing conditions within 2 hour.

Failure to have equipment in ready status when needed shall be cause for the Borough to immediately call in another contractor.

Equipment shall be free of excessive grease and oil leaks.

The contractor must comply with ADEC requirements for reporting of spills. Each piece of equipment must have a spill kit in the unit unless an equally effective alternative plan is approved.

Immediately clean up any and all spills in compliance with ADEC requirements

When equipment breaks down while performing winter maintenance, Contractor shall have the equipment repaired and running or have replacement equipment on site and operating within 1 hour.

6.2 Summer Equipment

Contractor shall provide a minimum of one grader per unit. Grader shall be at least 32,000 pounds GVWR, have a minimum 150 horsepower engine, and have a minimum wheel drive of 6x4.

Contractor shall obtain and maintain all permits and keep all equipment current with all local, State and Federal laws.

Contractor shall inspect and maintain equipment to manufacturer's specifications, allowing for ordinary/normal wear, on a routine schedule.

Equipment shall be free of excessive grease and oil leaks.

7.3 Gravel Roads:

Each spring locate and inspect all cross culverts. Promptly notify the Road Inspector of blocked driveway culverts. Mark all cross culverts.

Perform all grading when roads are at optimum moisture content.

Grading must be performed using a motorgrader as defined in equipment specifications.

Grade as needed throughout the summer to provide safe vehicular operation on a smooth driving surface. Potholes over two (2) inches in depth and one (1) foot in diameter exceeding more than 20 in any 100 feet of road must be corrected within 48 24 hours. Any individual pothole or combination of potholes that could cause vehicle damage or loss of vehicle control at normal driving speeds must be corrected immediately.

Grading shall include shaping shoulders, maintaining crown (minimum of 2%, maximum 4%), maintaining super elevations (minimum of 2%, maximum 4%), and grading intersections. Ditches shall be pulled if material is pushed into the ditch during grading operations. Obtain useable grading material for the road surface from the bottom of the ditches. Where ditches do not exist or ditch material is unusable, road surface grading shall be limited to the shoulder-to-shoulder width. Shape the shoulders to provide a smooth transition from the driving surface to the edge of the shoulders. Do not leave berms or wrinkles in the fore slopes and avoid filling ditches with material. After pulling the ditches, the roadway shall be cut and processed, then re-laid to produce an even surface. Where road surface and subgrade materials allow, potholes shall be cut out, not filled. Roads that have been graded and the potholes not cut out shall be re-graded.

Each day's work shall be complete. Leave no berms across driveways or intersections. Leave no rock or debris over 2 inches on the traveled surface. Where the road surface consists of cobbles in excess of 2-inches. Where suitable material is available, the road finished surface shall be left with a blended size gradation of materials that will compact.


In absence of specifications herein to the contrary, the following shall be used as standard maintenance practice guidelines for gravel roads.

Four-way intersections shall be crowned on the road with the highest volume of traffic.

At no time is the 2-4 percent crown to be maintained by cutting down the shoulders. Crown of the roadway shall be maintained by adding material to the total driving surface by pulling from shoulders. Super elevation shall be maintained.


Roads that become too wide shall be narrowed by pulling shoulders. Lay the material on the driving surface of the roadway.


7.7 Gravel Roads: Begin plowing as soon as snow accumulation on the road surface reaches 4-inches An example of a four (4) inch snowfall is a two (2) inch snowfall followed by a two (2) inch snowfall, or four (4) inch accumulation on the edge of road caused by traffic. Open all roads to full width within 24-hours, including all intersections. Maintain minimum sight distance at intersections. (**See Figure 3**).



If snow continues to fall after plowing commences, continue plowing, continuously if necessary, to reduce accumulations over four inches. In any event, do not allow more than 4-inches of new snow to accumulate for more than 24-hours on any road.

7.8 Paved Roads: Begin plowing as soon as snow accumulation on the road surface reaches 4-inches. An example of a four (4) inch snowfall is a two (2) inch snowfall followed by a two (2) inch snow fall, or four (4) inch accumulation on the road edge caused by traffic. Open all roads to full width traffic within 24- hours, including all intersections. (**See Figure 4**).





Do not plow snow beyond drivable surfaces.

In extreme storms, response times may be adjusted by the Owner.

7.9 Gravel Roads:

Total snow pack on all gravel roads may not exceed two (2) inches.

Paved Roads and approaches:

Total snow pack on paved roads may not exceed two (2) inch.

Icing Conditions:

Implement preventative measures before icing occurs to maintain road surfaces in compliance with this section.

Be alert, observant of road conditions, observant of weather, and react immediately without call-out to any and all icing conditions.

When icing conditions are reported by the RSA Inspector consider the report to be an order to respond immediately.

Eliminate any troughing and shoulder ice in excess of one (1) inch in depth.

Maintain braking traction on all roads at all times. Serration shall be the primary means of providing traction whenever it is feasible. Serration shall be to a minimum depth of 1/4 inch.

7.11 Miscellaneous Maintenance:

Damage caused by the Contractor to roads, bridges, signs, culverts, mailboxes, driveways, vehicles, private property, utilities and other items shall be the financial responsibility of the Contractor. Payment for damaged Borough property will be withheld from the Contractor's monthly payment.

Contractor shall notify owner when any damage or accidents occur while performing services in conjunction with this contract.

8. ADDITIONAL SERVICE:

Owner reserves the right to have the contractor perform additional services on an asneeded basis and may include gravel in place, culvert repair, culvert cleaning, culvert replacement, frost boil removal and repair, emergency tree removal, brushing, and culvert thawing.

Contractor shall provide pricing for additional services on the bid form provided by the owner.




9. PAYMENT

1. Staging Area:

Our staging area is conveniently located off of Echo Lake Rd allowing us to quickly access the maintenance unit. At this location we have a heated shop, electricity, fuel storage and tools for maintenance.

2. Refueling Procedures:

Fueling will be accomplished by one of two means. We have a 1000-gallon fuel tank located at our Echo Lake staging area. We also have a fuel truck for fueling the equipment when it is away from the staging areas.

3. Simultaneous Supervision of Multiple Units:

Dear Mr. Smith:

The Borough received your March 16, 2018, appeal of the Borough's intent to award a contract to Best Transit Mix, Inc. (hereinafter "BTM") for the West Region, Unit 7 Summer and Winter Road Maintenance. On March 20, 2018, the Borough provided notice of extension of the deadline date for the Mayor's decision on the appeal to April 6, 2018. The purpose of this letter is to provide my decision on your appeal.

You raised two issues on appeal:

- 1) You requested a determination that the bid submitted by BTM was non-responsive because BTM "did not include a Contractor License or Specialty Contractor License number as required on page 1 of 8 of the Cost proposal form."
- 2) The award of a maintenance contract to BTM for West Region, Unit 7, is improper because BTM "listed the same graders, as evidenced by the serial numbers, as Primary Equipment and Back-up Equipment on four (4) separate bids. This violates instructions on page 2 of 8 of the Cost Proposal Form which states, "A grader listed as primary equipment in one unit cannot be listed as primary or back-up equipment in another unit."

Summary of Decision on Appeal

This contract was awarded pursuant to KPB 5.28.250(E). The Borough used the Request for Proposal (RFP) procurement process not an Invitation to Bid (ITB) process in this case. The lowest responsive proposal by a responsive proposer was determined and the purchasing officer and agency head met with that proposer to clarify and assure full understanding of the requirements

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of the RFP. Following the meeting, it was determined that BTM was responsible, responsive and fully understood the requirements of the contract. For the reasons stated and discussed in more detail below, the appeal filed by D & L Construction Co., Inc., dated March 16, 2018, is **DENIED**.

Issue #1 - BTM not providing its Contractor's License Number or Specialty Contractor's License Number on its Cost Proposal

Appellant's Position: Requests a finding that the bid submitted by BTM was non-responsive because BTM "did not include a Contractor License or Specialty Contractor License number as required on page 1 of 8 of the Cost proposal form."

Having considered this issue raised on appeal, I find that the variance does not render BTM's proposal nonresponsive. Using the omission of a license number to find a proposal nonresponsive is unduly harsh and would undermine the integrity of the RFP process. The goal is to encourage competition, not stifle it. Paragraph 5 on the instructions for proposal submittal states, "Failure to submit all required information on the Proposal Form may result in rejection of the Contractor's proposal." Taking the word "may" in that sentence and looking at KPB 5.28.240, I find that it is within the discretion of the purchasing officer to waive irregularities such as failure to provide a Contractor's license number on the Contractor's proposal. Additionally, per paragraph 12 of the instructions for proposal, "The Borough may reject any or all proposals, may waive minor irregularities in any proposal or in the proposal procedure, or accept any proposal presented, and which is deemed in the best interest of the Borough." The purchasing officer's authority to waive certain irregularities is explicitly stated in Borough code and in the RFP documents.

Furthermore, I find that at the time of submitting its proposal, BTM was in substantial compliance with applicable law and the RFP documents. BTM is aware that it must provide a license number prior to the Borough entering into this contract. For these reasons, I do not find BTM's omission material and find that any irregularity with respect to this issue may be waived by the purchasing officer. The request to find BTM non-responsive due to its omission of a Contractor's License number or Specialty Contractor's License number on its proposal form is DENIED.

Issue #2 – BTM listing same equipment serial number for multiple units

Appellant's position: BTM "listed the same graders, as evidenced by the serial numbers, as

Primary Equipment and Back-up Equipment on four (4) separate bids. This

violates instructions on page 2 of 8 of the Cost Proposal Form"

Unlike the ITB process, the RFP process does not end with the submission of the bid. As part of the RFP process, the Borough "may negotiate with qualified and responsible proponents whose proposals are determined by the purchasing officer and agency head to be <u>reasonably</u> responsive to the request for proposals." KPB 5.28.250(E) (emphasis added). The purpose of the

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"negotiation" or meeting is to clarify and assure full understanding of the requirements for proposals. In addition, paragraph 2 of the instructions for proposal submittal document states that the Borough may request a proposer to submit evidence of qualifications and equipment. The intent of this particular RFP was to create an open, competitive bidding process for Borough road maintenance contracts.

The nature of the business being conducted (road maintenance) must also be considered in this case. Often, the only contractors that own the equipment required for these maintenance contracts are current Borough contractors. If the Borough strictly enforces a requirement that all required equipment must be owned prior to responding to the RFP, then the Borough would be restricting or stifling competition rather than encouraging competition. That is not an appropriate aim of the Borough.

In the present case, after finding BTM was the lowest responsive proposer, the purchasing officer and agency head met with BTM to address irregularities. It was determined that BTM understood the terms of the RFP and that BTM would have all necessary equipment and/or proof of purchase by the time of inspection, which is a condition of performance under the contract. BTM was aware of the requirement to obtain a distinct piece of primary equipment for each and every road maintenance unit awarded. BTM was aware that the equipment must meet or exceed the specifications of the grader it listed on its proposal and that even if it obtains superior equipment to the duplicative serial number equipment listed on its proposal, the same unit price as listed on its proposal will be used for payments under the contract. BTM understood that the Borough will inspect its equipment for each unit prior to execution of the contract and that the Borough's ability to inspect equipment and ensure compliance with contract documents exists throughout the life of the contract. The Purchasing & Contracting Director and Acting Roads Director had a reasonable basis for finding BTM responsive, responsible, and able to perform the requirements of the contract.

Considering the nature of the business in question it is reasonable to allow a contractor time to get necessary equipment—equipment (such as a grader) that is often specific to these road maintenance contracts. It is reasonable to expect a responsive proposer to obtain such equipment once notice of award is issued and prior to the time for executing the contract and performance. Allowing sufficient time for contractors to obtain required equipment, is one reason why the Borough issued this RFP in February for contracts that begin July 1. The RFP process was specifically used for this purpose. The purchasing officer and agency head should be permitted to meet with proposers to determine if the proposer is responsive, responsible and able to perform the requirements of the contract. Our code allows this. State law allows this. I find the practice to be in the best interests of the Borough in this case.

Similar to the irregularity raised by Issue #1 of this appeal, strict enforcement here would have undermined the competitive bidding process by placing the Borough in a position it sought

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to avoid; that of having no opportunity to fairly and honestly compare multiple responsive bids. Further, using strict application of RFP terms as a basis for rejecting a bid as non-responsive—without meeting with the proposer that might otherwise be found to be nonresponsive—has application beyond the instant case and goes to the integrity of the entire competitive bidding process. It would be improper for the Borough to discourage and stifle competition through unduly harsh application of RFP requirements via rigid adherence to form over substance.

Therefore, for the reasons stated, I uphold the decision to award this contract to BTM pending inspection and ability to fully comply with the requirements of the contract, and DENY the appeal filed by D & L Construction Co., Inc. March 16, 2018.

This denial constitutes a final action by the Mayor and is appealable to the Borough assembly pursuant to KPB 5.28.320(G). A copy of KPB 5.28.320 is attached to this decision. Pursuant to KPB 5.28.320(G), if you decide to appeal this decision to the assembly you must submit your appeal to the borough clerk in writing within three (3) business days of the date of this decision.

Dear Mayor Pierce,

In accordance with the KPB Code of Ordinances 5.28.320 we hereby appeal the INTENT TO AWARD dated May 9, 2022 to Alaska Scrap & Recycling for the Invitation to Bid – ITB 22-044 Summer & Winter Maintenance, West Region, Unit 6.

D & L Construction Co., Inc. was the lowest, qualified, responsive and responsible bidder for this project and should be awarded the contract for the following reasons:

- 1) Alaska Scrap & Recycling did not submit a bid for West Region, Unit 6 regardless of their stated intent after the bid opening. Page 2 of 2 as evidenced by their bid was for West Region, Unit 5 (see attached). They committed a bid error and should not have been declared the low bidder for West Region, Unit 6. Alaska Scrap & Recycling should not be allowed to benefit from their bid error at the expense of other bidders. The Instructions to Bidders, Item 10, states, in part, "Bids may be rejected if they show any omissions, alteration of the forms, additions not called for, conditional or alternate bids not called for, qualified bids, or irregularities of any kind." The Alaska Scrap & Recycling bid omitted the proper Bid Form, page 2 of 2 and therefore constituted an irregularity of the magnitude such that their bid should have been (be) declared nonresponsive for West Region, Unit 6. This contract should be awarded to D & L Construction Co., Inc.
- 2) The Instructions to Bidders, Item 10, states, in part, "Only the amounts and information asked for on the Bid Schedule will be considered as the bid. Each bidder shall bid upon the work exactly as specified and as requested on the Bid Schedule ..." Alaska Scrap & Recycling did not submit a bid with the amounts and information asked for on the Bid Schedule for West Region, Unit 6. Alaska Scrap & Recycling did not bid upon the work exactly as specified and as requested on the Bid Schedule for West Region, Unit 6 therefore their bid is nonresponsive and should have been (be) declared as such. This contract should be awarded to D & L Construction Co., Inc.

- 3) Alaska Scrap & Recycling did not properly acknowledge the Addendums issued for this project. Three Addendums were issued (see attached) prior to bid opening and they should have been acknowledged on the Bid Form, page 1 of 2, as such; i.e., 1, 2 & 3. Instead they appear to have been acknowledged as X X X (see attached). There were no X X X Addendums. Any subsequent contract entered into after award that changes the X X X Addendums to 1, 2 & 3 will not represent the bid as submitted and any changes to reflect the actual Addendums 1, 2 and 3 will constitute the falsification of documents and be fraudulent. This contract should be awarded to D & L Construction Co., Inc.
- 4) Any contract awarded pursuant to the KPB INTENT TO AWARD dated May 9, 2022 to Alaska Scrap & Recycling creates a dilemma for the KPB. One of two things will have to take place. The KPB may draft a contract using the Alaska Scrap & Recycling bid, in which case, a contract will be awarded for West Region, Unit 6 using a West Region, Unit 5 Bid Form. This will in effect create a fraudulent contract. On the other hand the KPB could request Alaska Scrap & Recycling to submit a revised bid using the West Region, Unit 6 Bid Form or the KPB could simply create their own copy of the West Region, Unit 6 Bid Form using the Alaska Scrap & Recycling numbers. In either case, this will constitute not only the falsification of documents but will again create a fraudulent contract. D & L submitted the lowest responsive bid and no falsification of documents or fraud would be involved in awarding them the contract for West Region, Unit 6.
- 5) The construction industry standard requires a fair and open competitive bidding process. The KPB failed in their duty to formally disclose the Alaska Scrap & Recycling bid error for West Region, Unit 6. The KPB did not notify D & L or, to the best of our knowledge, any other contractors, of the bid error. D & L was informed of the bid error by another bidder who was present at the bid opening. This conduct on behalf of the KPB is totally unacceptable and creates a very dangerous precedent for the KPB and all contractors who bid on KPB projects in the future. There appears to be a total lack of integrity on the part of the KPB when it comes to bid openings. KPB Purchasing & Contracting published a false and fraudulent bid tabulation for the West Region, Unit 4, 5 and 6 when they posted the Alaska Scrap & Recycling bid as being for West Region, Unit 6 when it was submitted on the Bid Form for West Region, Unit 5. Withdrawing the INTENT TO AWARD to Alaska Scrap & Recycling for the West Region, Unit 6 contract and awarding the contract to D & L will restore the integrity to this bid opening.
- 6) And finally, there is some question as to whom the KPB would be contracting with if they award this contract to Alaska Scrap & Recycling. Alaska Scrap & Recycling, LLC (1008882) does have a business license (982866) with an address of 720 E Whitney Road Anchorage, Alaska 99501 and a contractor's license (CONE38698) DBA S & R Enterprises (an involuntarily dissolved Alaska business corporation) with an Anchorage, Alaska address. However, the bid submitted by Alaska Scrap & Recycling for West Region, Unit 5 contains two different addresses. The Bid Form, page 1 of 2, has an address of 42462 K Beach Road (which according to KPB records is owned by SAS LLC) Soldotna, Alaska 99669 and the Tax Compliance Certification submitted has an address of 720 E Whitney Road Anchorage, Alaska 99501. The address at 42462 K Beach Road Soldotna, Alaska 99669 shows Alaska Scrap and Recycling as well as Peninsula Scrap & Salvage Co (another involuntary dissolved Alaska business corporation). This contract should be awarded to D & L Construction Co., Inc. who has maintained the same address in the KPB for nearly forty years.

Based upon all the reasons stated above we hereby request that the NOTICE OF AWARD to Alaska Scrap & Recycling for the Invitation to Bid – ITB22-044 Summer & Winter Maintenance West Region, Unit 6 be withdrawn and that the contract be awarded to D & L Construction Co., Inc.

The Borough received your May 12, 2022, appeal of the Borough's Intent to Award a contract to Alaska Scrap and Recycling ("the Bidder") for the West Region, Unit 6 Summer and Winter Road Maintenance. The purpose of this letter is to provide my decision on your appeal.

You raised six reasons for the appeal which I have reviewed and which are summarized as follows:

- 1. That the Bidder committed a bid error by submitting their bid on page 2 of 2 of the bid form for Unit 5.
- 2. The instructions to bidders for item 10 states, in part, "only the amounts and information asked for on the Bid Schedule will be considered as the bid. Each bidder shall bid upon the work exactly as specified and as requested on the Bid Schedule" and because of this the Bidder did not bid the work exactly as specified.
- 3. The Bidder did not properly acknowledge the Addendums issued for this project.
- 4. Incorporation of Bid documents into the contract creates a dilemma for KPB: 1) KPB drafts a contract for West Region, Unit 6 using the Bidder's bid using a West Region, Unit 5 Bid form; or 2) KPB asks the Bidder to submit a revised bid using the West Region, Unit 6 Bid Form; or 3) KPB creates its own copy of West Region, Unit 6 Bid Form using the Bidder's numbers. Any of those choices would constitute falsification of documents and a fraudulent contract.
- 5. KPB failed to notify D&L Construction or any other contractors of the bid error.

6. Confusion regarding the Bidder's business license.

Summary of Decision on Appeal

Reason 1: References to Section 10 are noted and bidders should be aware of complications that may lead to a rejection of their bid. Section 13 Acceptance – Rejection of Bids, states that, "The Borough reserves the right to reject any or all bids, to waive minor irregularities in any bids or in the bidding procedure, and to accept any bid presented which meets or exceeds said specifications and which is deemed to be in the best interest of the Borough. Please see KPB Code of Ordinances, section 5.28.240 – Waiver of irregularities, emphasis added.

In this instance the Bidder mistakenly submitted sheet two of the bid form on the Unit 5 page 2 of 2. The signature page of this bid was appropriately submitted on sheet 1 of 2 for Unit 6. The Bidder's intention is clearly indicated by their submission and signature on the bid form for Unit 6, page 1 of 2. It is also important to note that the Bidder stated their intention to submit a bid for Unit 6 at the bid opening, immediately upon the reading of their bid.

Reason 2: The pages 2 of 2 in the ITB for all three Units' bid forms are identical with the exception of the noted Unit in the title block on each sheet. The Bid Schedule on the Unit 5 bid form page 2 of 2 is exactly the same as the bid schedule on the Unit 6 bid form page 2 of 2 and would not alter the values in any way.

Reason 3: Based on the recommendation of the Purchasing and Contracting Director, it is reasonable to assume that three check boxes on the Bid Form for Unit 6 serve to acknowledge the Bidder's acceptance of the three addendums issues for this ITB. All addenda will be included in the contract documents upon award.

Reason 4: This is acknowledged as a minor irregularity. Clarification of the intent will be addressed through the contract award process.

Reason 5: On May 6, 2022, at 2:44 pm, and prior to the intent to award, the Purchasing and Contracting Director responded to a request from D&L Construction about the ITB22-044 bid opening (attached). The body of the email stated the following:

"Upon further review of the bid documents the signature page of the bid was in fact for Unit 6. The error was in the use of the bid sheet for Unit 5. That bid sheet is identical to the Unit 6 sheet in format and does not alter the value provided. It was apparent through the signature page and the response from the contractor at the bid opening that the intent was to submit a bid for Unit 6. This is a minor irregularity and is not cause for finding Alaska Scrap and Recycling's bid nonresponsive."

This email also included a copy of the Bid Form pages 1 of 2 and 2 of 2, for reference.

As such, the Borough did respond to D&L regarding the minor irregularity in the bid process. All other claims under this Section are addressed in the explanations above.

Reason 6: The Bidder currently operates three other Roads Service Area Winter and Summer Maintenance contracts under the licensing provided in the bid tab. No discrepancies with that existing licensing status are known to exist at this time.

Therefore, for the reasons stated, your appeal is denied. The decision to award this contract to Alaska Scrap and Recycling is upheld pending inspection and ability to fully comply with the requirements of the contract. March 18, 2022.

This denial constitutes a final action by the Mayor and is appealable to the Borough assembly pursuant to KPB 5.28.320(G). A copy of KPB 5.28.320 is attached to this decision. Pursuant to KPB 5.28.320(G), if you decide to appeal this decision to the assembly you must submit your appeal to the borough clerk in writing within three (3) business days of the date of this decision.

- (a) Bids received after the bid due date and time indicated on the invitation to bid may not be accepted unless the delay was due to an error of the contracting agency.
- (b) Correction or withdrawal of inadvertently erroneous bids before or after bid opening, or cancellation of awards or contracts based on bid mistakes may be permitted in accordance with regulations adopted by the commissioner. After bid opening, changes in bid prices or other provisions of bids prejudicial to the interest of the state or fair competition may not be permitted. Except as otherwise provided by regulation, a decision to permit the correction or withdrawal of a bid, or to cancel an award or contract based on bid mistake, shall be supported by a written determination made by the procurement officer. If a bidder is permitted to withdraw a bid before award, an action may not be maintained against the bidder or the bid security.

After applying any preferences that apply under AS 36.15.050 and AS 36.30.321 - 36.30.338, a procurement officer shall award a contract based on the solicited bids with reasonable promptness by written notice to the lowest responsible and responsive bidder whose bid conforms in all material respects to the requirements and criteria set out in the invitation to bid.

Appeal of the Mayor's Decision Regarding RFP 22-044, Summer & Winter

Road Maintenance - West Region Unit 6

Administration Written Argument and Presentation

The appellant, D&L Construction, raised six points in its appeal to the mayor. The appeal points are in the materials, but can be summarized as follows:

Point 1: That the Bidder committed a bid error by submitting their bid on page 2 of 2 of the bid form for Unit 5, instead of Unit 6, and as such was non-responsive.

Point 2: The instructions to bidders for Item 10 states, in part, "only the amounts and information asked for on the Bid Schedule will be considered as the bid. Each bidder shall bid upon the work exactly as specified and as requested on the Bid Schedule" and because of this the Bidder did not bid the work exactly as specified and the bid should be considered non-responsive.

Point 3: The Bidder did not properly acknowledge the Addendums issued for this project.

Point 4: Incorporation of Bid documents into the contract created a problem for KPB as follows: 1) KPB drafted a contract for West Region, Unit 6 using the Bidder's bid using a West Region, Unit 5 Bid form; or 2) KPB asks the Bidder to submit a revised bid using the West Region, Unit 6 Bid Form; or 3) KPB creates its own copy of West Region, Unit 6 Bid Form using the Bidder's numbers. Any of

those choices would constitute falsification of documents and a fraudulent contract.

Point 5: KPB failed to notify D&L Construction or any other contractors of the bid error.

Point 6. There was confusion regarding the Bidder's business license.

The Administration responds as follows:

Point 1: References to Section 10 are noted and bidders should be aware of complications that may lead to a rejection of their bid. However, Section 10 states that bids "may" be rejected, not that it is *required* in every instance of an irregularity. Section 13 Acceptance – Rejection of Bids, specifically states that, "The Borough reserves the right to reject any or all bids, *to waive minor irregularities* in any bids or in the bidding procedure, and to accept any bid presented which meets or exceeds said specifications and which is deemed to be in the best interest of the Borough. See KPB Code of Ordinances, section 5.28.240 – Waiver of irregularities, (emphasis added).

In this instance, the Bidder mistakenly submitted sheet two of the bid form on the Unit 5 page 2 of 2. The signature page of this bid was appropriately submitted on sheet 1 of 2 for Unit 6. The Bidder's intention was clearly indicated by their submission and signature on the bid form for Unit 6, page 1 of 2. It is also important to note that the Bidder stated their intention to submit a bid for Unit 6 at the bid opening, immediately upon the reading of their bid. The bidder's use of the incorrect sheet was an irregularity and accordingly, was appropriately waived by the Purchasing Officer.

Point 2: The pages 2 of 2 in the ITB for all three Units' bid forms are identical with the exception of the noted Unit in the title block on each sheet. The Bid Schedule on the Unit 5 bid form page 2 of 2 is exactly the same as the bid schedule on the Unit 6 bid form page 2 of 2 and would not alter the values in any way. This issue is part of the same fact pattern as raised in Issue 1, was a minor irregularity, and accordingly, was appropriately waived by the Purchasing Officer.

Point 3: Under the facts of this matter, it is reasonable to assume that the three check boxes on the Bid Form for Unit 6 serve to acknowledge the Bidder's acceptance of the three addendums issued for this ITB. In any event, all addenda will be included in the contract documents upon award. Not only does this not constitute a "fraudulent contract" it is not even clear that it is an irregularity in need of a waiver. Nonetheless, to the degree it is an irregularity, it also was appropriately waived by the action of the Purchasing Officer.

Point 4: This is acknowledged as a minor irregularity and was also appropriately waived by the Purchasing Officer. Clarification of the intent will be addressed through the contract award process.

Point 5: Although there is no requirement that the Purchasing Officer inform other bidders of a "bid error" (in this case, an irregularity), nonetheless, on May 6, 2022, at 2:44 pm, and prior to the intent to award, the Purchasing and Contracting Director responded to a request from D&L Construction about the ITB22-044 bid opening (attached). The body of the email stated the following:

"Upon further review of the bid documents the signature page of the bid was in fact for Unit 6. The error was in the use of the bid sheet for Unit 5. That bid sheet is identical to the Unit 6 sheet in format and does not alter the value provided. It was apparent through the signature page and the response from the contractor at the bid opening that the intent was to submit a bid for Unit 6. This is a minor irregularity and is not cause for finding Alaska Scrap and Recycling's bid nonresponsive."

This email also included a copy of the Bid Form pages 1 of 2 and 2 of 2, for reference.

As such, the Borough did respond to D&L regarding the minor irregularity in the bid process. All other claims under this Section are addressed in the explanations above.

Point 6: The Bidder currently operates three other Roads Service Area Winter and Summer Maintenance contracts under the licensing provided in the bid tab. No discrepancies with that existing licensing status are known to exist at this time. As such, Alaska Scrap and Recycling has the necessary business license. Again, this is not an irregularity, or other error, but to the degree it is, it was appropriately waived by the Purchasing Officer based on the KPB already having a proper business license from Alaska Scrap and Recycling.

As noted, to the degree any of these are actual problems or irregularities, KPB 5.28. 240 specifically allows the purchasing officer to waive irregularities. There are no particular areas that cannot be waived except the two noted in the ordinance, as long as the purposes of the purchasing code are met. This code provision states:

5.28.240. - Waiver of irregularities.

The purchasing officer shall have the authority to waive irregularities on any and all bids, except that timeliness and signature requirements shall not be waived.

As long as the process – including any waiver of irregularities - used in ultimately awarding the bid fulfills the purpose of the purchasing code, then the award of the bid is legal and should be upheld.

The purpose of the purchasing code is set forth as follows:

5.28.010. - Purpose.

The purpose of this chapter is to:

- A. Establish consistent procurement principles for all agencies of the borough;
- B. Ensure the fair and equitable treatment of all persons who deal with the procurement system of the borough;
- C. Maximize fair and open competition and to discourage collusive bidding for borough contracts;
- D. Maximize to the fullest extent practicable, the purchasing value of borough funds; and to
- E. Clearly define authority for the purchasing function within the borough organization.

The entire bidding process, including the waiver of irregularities, fulfilled these purposes. It was, and remains, a fair and open competition that ensured the fair and equitable treatment of all persons involved. It also ensured the maximization of the purchasing value of borough funds, which, ultimately is in the best interest of the borough.

Finally, based on an Alaska Supreme Court case with similar facts (Chris Berg, Inc. v. State, Dep't of Transp. & Pub. Facilities, 680 P.2d 93, 94 (Alaska 1984)) KPB was, under the factual circumstances, not only permitted, but *legally required* to award the bid to Alaska Scrap and Recycling as the lowest responsive and responsible bidder. To do otherwise, as the Court in the Berg case stated, would have been an abuse of discretion on the part of the Purchasing Officer.

In the <u>Berg</u> case, Chris Berg's corporation bid on a State DOT project, but in bid documents he mistakenly wrote price information for a line item, that was meant to be on one line lower than where it was written (similar to Alaska Scrap and Recycling using one incorrect sheet of the two, for the unit it bid on). In the Berg case, a state contract official, by examining the bid, determined that the price information for that line item had mistakenly

been written one line below. Using the total bid price, which was not mistaken, as well as some elementary mathematics, the official was able to discern the nature of the mistake and the intended price for the line item.

The state official then contacted Chris Berg's corporation and asked a representative to read him the intended bid for the mistaken portion. The intended bid corresponded to official's interpretation. Accordingly, the official stated to the corporate representative that no further documents were necessary and that the bid would be accepted.

However, higher State DOT officials later reversed that determination stating the bid was "non-responsive" and "beyond the flexibility" of DOT. Chris Berg filed an administrative appeal which was denied and then appealed to Superior Court which also denied his request.

However, upon appealing to the Alaska Supreme Court it reversed the lower court and ruled in Mr. Berg's favor stating:

"A minor technical defect or *irregularity* which does not and could not affect the substance of a low bid in any way does not justify the rejection of that bid on the ground that it is not responsive, when the agency is required by law to award the contract to the "lowest responsible bidder." We believe that the bid error in the present case falls within this category, since the mistake and the bid actually intended are reasonably ascertainable from the invitation to bid and the bid itself, and the mistake was discovered immediately by the agency. Thus, any rejection of Chris Berg's bid on the basis of the bid error would constitute an abuse of discretion as a matter of law." (Emphasis added).

Chris Berg, Inc. v. State, Dep't of Transp. & Pub. Facilities, 680 P.2d 93, 94–95 (Alaska 1984)

The current administrative appeal before the Assembly parallels in Supreme Court's <u>Berg</u> decision in the same way.

In the borough matter the Purchasing Officer did not even need to expend as much effort as in the <u>Berg</u> case, to ascertain the intent of the bid by Alaska Scrap and Recycling. It was apparent both from the bid sheets used and from the comment of the bidder at bid opening that he had used the wrong sheet from what he intended.

The Purchasing Officer immediately learned of a minor irregularity which could not affect the substance of the low bid as being the responsive bid. Further, for the Purchasing Officer to have rejected Alaska Scrap and Recycling's Bid as non-responsive would have been an abuse of discretion by the Purchasing Officer and exposed KPB to a lawsuit by Alaska Scrap and Recycling.

Accordingly, the Administration asks the Assembly to follow the example of the Alaska Supreme Court and uphold the waiver of irregularities and the Mayor's decision on appeal.

Dear Assembly Members:

This letter is in response to the appeal of the Kenai Peninsula Borough's (KPB's) Intent to Award Alaska Scrap and Recycling, LLC (AS&R) the Summer and Winter Maintenance for West Region Unit 6.

I will start with a brief introduction of myself. My name is Paul Keen. I have been employed at the same job since 1986. During these 36 years, the company ownership has changed five times but the commitment to the high level of service provided by AS&R remains unchanged. The type of work has varied from oilfield support, septic pumping and installation, refuse hauling, metal recycling, road maintenance, and KPB road projects. I have been in a supervisory position since 1996. My first KPB road maintenance contract began in December 2007 with Central Unit 4. I have performed maintenance duties for that Unit for the last 15 years. June 30 will be the end of my service in this Unit. I have managed as many as 5 KPB road maintenance contracts simultaneously and have done so with a good record. We had West Region Unit 1 during the flood disaster of 2013. We worked closely with the Roads Department and provided the KPB with high quality service at a fair and equitable price during this emergency in our community. In 2012, we formed AS&R. With this new company, we maintained our location at 42462 K-Beach Road and opened a metal recycling center in Anchorage.

AS&R agrees with KPB's initial award of West Unit 6 to AS&R. Below I will go item by item and refute the claims made by Mr. Smith in D&L Construction Co., Inc.'s appeal:

- 1) AS&R did submit a bid for West Region Unit 6. The sealed envelope was clearly labeled ITB 22-044 Summer and Winter Maintenance West Region Unit 6. The signature page was for Unit 6. The minor error was in the bid sheet. Each Unit's bid sheet was identical except for the Unit number. John Hedges, after consulting with the KPB Legal Department, ruled that having the wrong bid sheet was not cause for finding AS&R's bid unresponsive. I clearly stated prior to the opening of the bids that I was only bidding on West Region Unit 6 and no other Units. Roads Inspector Jed Painter and Shawn Holly of River City Construction were both present when I made the statement.
- 2) AS&R did submit a bid with the amounts and information asked for on the bid schedule, and the bid was for the work exactly as specified and requested by the KPB. John Hedges' communication with Mr. Smith also confirms that the signature page of the bid was in fact for West Region Unit 6. The error was only in the use of the bid sheet for Unit 5. It was very clear that AS&R bid on West Region Unit 6, and the submitted bid sheet was identical to the Unit 6 sheet in format and does not alter the value of the bid provided. The signature page clearly stated the bid was for West Region Unit 6, and the response from the contractor at the bid opening confirmed that the bid was for West Region Unit 6. This is a minor irregularity and is not cause for finding the low bid as unresponsive.

- 3) AS&R did acknowledge all 3 addendums.
- 4) KPB issued its intent to award to the lowest responsive bidder for West Region Unit 6. Mayor Charlie Pierce upheld John Hedges' decision on this matter. No fraudulent activity or falsification has occurred, nor has it been considered related to the award of the contract for West Region Unit 6. Any allegations in this regard are completely unfounded.
- 5) AS&R fails to see any lack of integrity by the KPB. John Hedges called me approximately 1 hour after the bid opening. He stated that he needed to check with the KPB legal department prior to issuing the Intent to Award for West Region Unit 6. Mr. Hedges also stated that there would most likely be an appeal. I have been working for the KPB for 15 years continuously and have never witnessed what Mr. Smith is describing. The KPB personnel has been very transparent and acted with the utmost integrity. All the bid processes that I have been involved with the KPB have been fair and open.
- 6) Finally, Mr. Smith believes there is some question as to whom the KPB would be contracting with for West Region Unit 6. It is very clearly AS&R. The company was formed in 2012. It leases property and buildings located at 42462 K-Beach Road, Soldotna, AK 99669. We have leased from SAS Properties, LLC since 2012, and our current lease term goes until 2027. I am a partner along with the founders of our current business. I started working for my current partners in May 1999. We have every intention to keep providing valuable services to the KPB in any capacity whether it is for the Roads Department or the Solid Waste Department.

As lowest responsive bidder, AS&R is committed to continuing to provide exemplary service to the KPB and West Region Unit 6. We respectfully request the KPB reject this unfounded appeal.
